22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Section 31-9-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is
24	amended to read as follows:
25	<b>"</b> §31-9-3.
26	"As used in this article, these terms shall have the
27	following meanings:

"(1) EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT. The preparation for and 1 2 the carrying out of all emergency functions, other than functions for which military forces or other federal agencies 3 are primarily responsible, to prevent, minimize, and repair 4 5 injury and damage resulting from disasters caused by enemy 6 attack, sabotage, or other hostile action, or by fire, flood, 7 earthquake, or other natural cause. These functions include, without limitation, public safety services such as 8 9 fire-fighting services; police services; medical and health 10 services; rescue, engineering, air raid warning services; communications; radiological, chemical, and other special 11 weapons of defense; evacuation of persons from stricken areas; 12 13 emergency welfare services (civilian war aid); emergency 14 transportation; plant protection; temporary restoration of 15 public utility services; and other functions related to civilian protection, together with all other activities 16 17 necessary or incidental to the preparation for and carrying 18 out of the foregoing functions.

- "(2) LOCAL ORGANIZATION. The organization of local emergency management forces designed principally for operation within their own community but capable of moving to other areas.
- "(3) POLITICAL SUBDIVISION. Any county or municipality created pursuant to law.

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"(4) STATE PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY. An occurrence or imminent threat of an illness or health condition that does all of the following:

- 1 "a. Is believed to be caused by any of the
- 2 following:
- 3 "1. Bioterrorism.
- "2. The appearance of a novel or previouslycontrolled or eradicated infectious agent or biological toxin.
- 6 "3. A natural disaster.
- 7 "4. A chemical attack or accidental release.
- 8 "5. A nuclear or radiological attack or accident.
- 9 "b. Poses a high probability of any of the following
- 10 harms:

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- "1. A large number of deaths in the affected population.
- "2. A large number of serious or long-termdisabilities in the affected population.
- "3. Widespread exposure to an infectious or toxic
  agent that poses a significant risk of substantial future harm
  to a large number of people in the affected population.
  - "(5) STATE OF EMERGENCY. When the Governor duly proclaims the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by fire, flood, storm, epidemic, technological failure or accident, riot, drought, sudden and severe energy shortage, plant or animal infestation or disease, earthquake, explosion, terrorism, or man-made disaster, or other conditions, other than conditions resulting from a labor controversy or conditions causing a state of war emergency, which, by reason of their magnitude, are or are likely to be

beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and 1 2 facilities of any single county, city and county, or city, and require the combined forces of a mutual aid region or regions 3 to combat, or energy shortage requires extraordinary measures 4 5 beyond the authority vested in the Alabama Public Service Commission.

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"(6) STATE TECHNOLOGICAL EMERGENCY. An emergency caused by a technological failure or accident, including, but not limited to, an explosion, transportation accident, radiological accident, or chemical or other hazardous material incident."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
