13		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
14		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
15		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
16		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
17		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
18		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
19		becoming effective with regard to a local
20		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
21		unless: it comes within one of a number of
22		specified exceptions; it is approved by the
23		affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates
24		funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
25		the entity for the purpose.
26		The purpose or effect of this bill would be
27		to require a new or increased expenditure of local

funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, 1 2 the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to 3 become effective because it comes within one of the 5 specified exceptions contained in the amendment. 7 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 9 AN ACT 10 Relating to law enforcement officers, judges, and 11 prosecutors; restricting the disclosure of addresses or 12 13 telephone numbers of those individuals; providing for 14 penalties; and in connection therewith would have as its 15 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased 16 expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 17 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as 18 Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended. 19 2.0 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 21 Section 1. by means of any device or process, to members of the public

capable of receiving the information.

(2) LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER. As used in this section, the term includes an employee, as defined in Section 41-13-7 of the Code of Alabama 1975, for purposes of nondisclosure of personal information in public records and an officer employed by any state, county, or municipality who is certified by the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission and has the power of arrest.

(3) PERSON. An individual, corporation, business trust, estate, trust, partnership, limited liability company, association, joint venture, government, governmental subdivision, agency, or instrumentality, public corporation, or any other legal or commercial entity.

Section 2. (a) (1) No person may disclose the home address or unpublished home telephone number of any active or retired law enforcement officer or the spouse or child of a law enforcement officer with the intent of exposing the law enforcement officer or spouse or child of an active or retired law enforcement officer to harassment or the risk of harm to life or property or in disregard of the possibility of such exposure.

- (2) A violation of this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
- (b) Any person that violates subsection (a) shall be liable to the individual or individuals residing at the home address of the active or retired law enforcement officer for damages, pecuniary or otherwise, which occurred as a result of disclosing the address.

- 1 (c) The court may award any of the following:
- 2 (1) Any actual damages, but not less than liquidated
- damages, computed at the rate of one thousand dollars (\$1,000)
- 4 for each violation of this act.

- 5 (2) Any punitive damages upon proof of willful or reckless disregard of the law.
- 7 (3) Reasonable attorney's fees and other litigation 8 costs reasonably incurred.
- 9 (4) Any other preliminary and equitable relief as 10 the court determines to be appropriate.

Section 3. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
