21		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama

25		prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect
26		would be to require a new or increased expenditure
27		of local funds from becoming effective with regard

to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective with regard to a local entity unless approved by the local entity or until, and only as long as, the Legislature appropriates funds or provides for a local source of revenue.

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Relating to drinking water bottle use in public K-12 schools; to require the installation of water bottle filling stations in certain public K-12 school buildings; and to regulate the use of filling stations and water bottles by individuals in public K-12 schools; and in connection therewith to have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of

- 1 1901, as amended by Amendment 890, now appearing as Section
- 2 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
- 3 Alabama of 1901, as amended.

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- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- Section 1. (a) This section applies to all of the following:
- 7 (1) Any existing public K-12 school building for 8 which otherwise applicable state or local building or plumbing 9 codes or state or local laws or regulations would require a 10 change in the amount of drinking fountains on or after June 6, 11 2021.
  - (2) Any existing public K-12 school building that undergoes any renovation affecting any of its existing plumbing fixtures or drinking fountains on or after June 6, 2021.
  - (3) Public K-12 school buildings constructed on or after June 6, 2021.
  - (b) Notwithstanding any otherwise applicable state or local building or plumbing codes or state or local laws or regulations that specifically pertain to the number of required drinking fountains in a public K-12 school building, public K-12 school buildings described in subsection (a) shall meet the following requirements:
  - (1) A minimum of one water bottle filling station per 100 individuals projected to occupy the building upon completion of the proposed construction.

- 1 (2) A minimum of one water bottle filling station on 2 each floor and wing of each building.
  - (3) A minimum of one water bottle filling station located in or near gymnasiums, cafeterias, and other high-traffic areas.

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- (c) Water bottle filling stations installed pursuant to this section may be integrated into drinking fountains.
- (d) A water bottle filling station installed pursuant to this section shall dispense cooled and filtered drinking water and be regularly cleaned and maintained.
- (e) Water bottles shall be allowed for use by students, teachers, and staff of a public K-12 school, and shall meet all of the following criteria:
- (1) Be made of a material that is not easily breakable.
  - (2) Have a lid to prevent spills.
  - (3) Be used exclusively for water.
  - (f) Water bottles shall be allowed in classrooms of public K-12 schools, but may be excluded from libraries, computer labs, science labs, and other places where it may be deemed dangerous to have or consume drinking water.
  - (g) Local boards of education may establish policies governing the use of water bottles pursuant to this section.

Section 2. The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended by Amendment 890, now appearing as

Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the 1 2 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended. If this bill is 3 not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective with regard to a local entity unless approved by the local entity 4 or until, and only as long as, the Legislature appropriates 5 funds or provides for a local source of revenue. 6 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 7 first day of the third month following its passage and 8 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
