valid photo identification as required under Section 17-9-30
 so that the elector is verified through the electronic poll
 book or printed poll list at the polling place.

5 elector using curbside voting a paper ballot. After marking
6 the paper ballot, the eligible elector shall deposit the
7 ballot in a secure container provided by the judge of probate.

(3) The observing election officials shall maintain
a record of each use of curbside voting at the polling place.

15 Section 2. This act shall become effective 16 immediately following its passage and approval by the 17 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law, and shall apply to 18 elections commencing with the November 2022 general election 19 cycle.
