Under existing law, certain regional mental 8 SYNOPSIS: health programs and facilities are authorized to 9 10 incorporate as a public corporation with powers 11 prescribed by law, including the power to provide 12 services such as inpatient care, outpatient care, 13 partial hospitalization, emergency care, 14 residential care, and aftercare for persons 15 combating all forms of mental or emotional 16 illnesses or disabilities, including alcoholism, 17 drug addiction, epilepsy, and intellectual 18 disability. The public corporations are exempted

from state taxation by law.

This bill would provide that regional mental health programs and facilities organized pursuant to law, and the directors and employees thereof, when engaged in the discharge of services or programs certified and contracted for by the Alabama Department of Mental Health, are entitled to immunity to the same extent and under the same

- (c) An entity organized pursuant to this chapter shall not be liable for any conduct protected pursuant to subsection (b).
 - (d) Subsections (b) and (c) do not apply to subcontractors or independent contractors of an entity organized pursuant to this chapter.
- (e) This section only applies to claims that accrue on or after the effective date of the act adding this code section.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
