24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. The following amendment to the
26	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become

valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of this act are fulfilled:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

- (a) In Lee County, all vacancies in the office of judge of the circuit court and the office of judge of the district court shall be filled in the manner and for the time as provided in this amendment.
- (b) The Lee County Judicial Commission is created for the purpose of nominating to the Governor individuals for appointment to any vacancy in the offices of judge of the circuit court and judge of the district court.
- (c) The eight members of the commission shall
 consist of the following:
- (1) The presiding judge of the Circuit Court of Lee County, as a nonvoting ex officio member who may only vote in the event of a tie vote among the other six members of the commission. The presiding judge shall preside over all meetings of the commission.
- (2) A practicing attorney in Lee County in good standing with the Alabama State Bar, who is a member of the Lee County Bar Association, and whose practice specializes in criminal prosecution.
- (3) A practicing attorney in Lee County in good standing with the Alabama State Bar, who is a member of the Lee County Bar Association, and whose practice specializes in criminal defense.

1 (4) A practicing attorney in Lee County in good 2 standing with the Alabama State Bar, who is a member of the 3 Lee County Bar Association, and whose practice specializes in 4 domestic relations.

- (5) A practicing attorney in Lee County in good standing with the Alabama State Bar, who is a member of the Lee County Bar Association, and whose practice specializes in civil defense litigation.
- (6) A practicing attorney in Lee County in good standing with the Alabama State Bar, who is a member of the Lee County Bar Association, and whose practice specializes in civil plaintiff litigation.
- (7) A practicing attorney in Lee County in good standing with the Alabama State Bar, who is a member of the Lee County Bar Association, and whose practice specializes in probate law.
- (8) One resident of Lee County who is not a member of the Alabama State Bar.
- (d) (1) The seven members of the commission who are required to be members of the Alabama State Bar and the Lee County Bar Association shall be nominated by the Lee County Bar Association Executive Committee and be elected by the members of the Lee County Bar Association whose primary practice or principal office is located in the territorial jurisdiction of Lee County.
- (2) The Executive Committee of the Lee County Bar Association, or its successor body, shall adopt rules, not

inconsistent with this amendment, for the election of the members of the commission as required in subdivision (1).

- (3) The Executive Committee of the Lee County Bar Association shall certify in writing, to the Judge of Probate of Lee County, the names of the individuals elected as members of the commission by the Lee County Bar Association.
- (e) The one non-lawyer member of the commission shall be appointed by mutual consent of the members of the Legislature who represent Lee County.
- (f) The term of office shall be for six years. A member may not serve more than two consecutive terms.
- (g) The Judge of Probate of Lee County shall record all certificates of election and shall safely and permanently retain the original and all subsequent certifications of election. Upon receipt and recordation of a certificate of election, the Judge of Probate shall immediately send a certified copy to the Governor.
- (h) A member of the commission may not seek appointment in the office of judge of the circuit court or judge of the district court while serving as a member of the commission.
- (i) The members of the commission may not receive any salary or other compensation for their service as members.
- (j) The members of commission may not hold any elected public office nor hold any official position in a political party.

- 1 (k) If a vacancy occurs in the office of judge of 2 the circuit court or judge of the district court, the presiding judge of the Circuit Court of Lee County shall call 3 a meeting of the commission to fill the vacancy. The 5 commission shall nominate three individuals who meet the qualifications for the vacant office. The nominations shall be made only by the concurrence of a majority of the members of the commission. The presiding judge of the Circuit Court of 9 Lee County shall certify the three nominees to the Governor, 10 who shall appoint one of the three nominees to the vacant office. If the Governor fails to make an appointment within 30 11 days from the date of submission, the appointment shall be 12 13 made by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court.
- 14 (1) The appointment shall hold office for an initial 15 term as provided by law.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held at the next general election in accordance with Section 284.01 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Relating to Lee County, proposing an amendment to 1 2 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to establish the Lee County Judicial Commission and provide for the filling of 3 vacancies in the office of judge of the circuit court and 4 judge of the district court. 5 "Proposed by Act " 6 This description shall be followed by the following 7 language: 8 "Yes () No ()." 9
