5 TO BE ENTITLED

6 AN ACT  
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8 Relating to law enforcement; to the Alabama Criminal  
9 Justice Information System (ACJIS) to collect data regarding  
10 allegations of excessive force by state, county, and municipal  
11 law enforcement officers; to require the ACJIS to compile  
12 certain data related to incidents involving excessive force;  
13 and to require the ACJIS to submit an annual report relating  
14 to incidents involving excessive force to certain legislative  
15 committees.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

17 Section 1. The Legislature finds and declares the  
18 following:

19 (1) The preservation of human life is of the highest  
20 value in this state.

21 (2) It is of utmost importance that law enforcement  
22 agencies implement policies and practices to prohibit the use  
23 of unnecessary lethal force by law enforcement officers.

24 (3) Law enforcement officers should be properly  
25 trained to reduce the prevalence of incidents involving  
26 excessive force.

1                   Section 2. (a) Beginning on January 1, 2018, the  
2 ACJIS shall collect data regarding any and all allegations of  
3 excessive force by state, county, and municipal law  
4 enforcement officers.

5                   (b) The ACJIS shall collect data for all incidents,  
6 including the race of the officer and the victim or victims,  
7 specific facts relating to the incident, whether the incident  
8 was subject to court action and final disposition of the court  
9 action, and the final determination of any local review of the  
10 incident.

11                   (c) Using the data collected under subsection (b),  
12 the ACJIS shall compile an annual report that shall be  
13 presented to the House Public Safety and Homeland Security  
14 Committee and the Senate Judiciary Committee.

15                   Section 3. This act shall become effective on the  
16 first day of the third month following its passage and  
17 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
