Relating to law enforcement officers; to require the Alabama Peace Officers' Training Commission to include crisis intervention training in the training curriculum of all active law enforcement officers; to require that all active law enforcement officers complete crisis intervention continuing education training within a specified time frame. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) The Alabama Peace Officers' Standards 8 and Training Commission shall include 40 hours of crisis 9 10 intervention training in the certification training required 11 under Chapter 21 of Title 36 of the Code of Alabama 1975, 12 designed to de-escalate encounters between certified law 13 enforcement officers and individuals experiencing a mental health crisis at the time of the encounter. The requirement 14 15 for completion of crisis intervention training shall apply to 16 the following law enforcement personnel:

17 (1) All law enforcement officers hired after the
18 effective date of this act, not later than January 1, 2018.

(2) All law enforcement officers hired prior to the
effective date of this act, not later than September 30, 2019.

(b) Crisis intervention continuing education
training shall be administered by the Alabama Peace Officers'
Standards and Training Commission for all law enforcement
officers not less than once every five years following the
initial crisis intervention training certification.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
