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8	To amend Sections 34-33-1, 34-33-2, 34-33-4,
9	34-33-5, 34-33-6, 34-33-7, 34-33-9, and 34-33-10, Code of
10	Alabama 1975, relating to fire protection and fire protection
11	sprinkler systems; to allow the State Fire Marshal to issue
12	permits to certain fire protection sprinkler contractors; to
13	require a certified licensed engineer to design the plans for
14	a residential fire protection sprinkler system and approve any
15	system design changes; and to require the State Fire Marshal
16	to collect and publish certain data and make the information
17	available on the website of the State Fire Marshal.
18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. Sections 34-33-1, 34-33-2, 34-33-4,
20	34-33-5, 34-33-6, 34-33-7, 34-33-9, and 34-33-10, Code of
21	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
22	"§34-33-1.
23	"For purposes of this chapter, the following words
24	and phrases shall have the meanings respectively ascribed in
25	this section:
26	" (3)<u>(</u>1) CERTIFICATE HOLDER. An individual who is
27	listed on the State Fire Marshal's permit as the responsible

1 managing owner, partner, officer or employee who is actively 2 in charge of the work of the certified fire protection 3 sprinkler contractor.

4 "(2) CERTIFIED FIRE PROTECTION SPRINKLER CONTRACTOR.
5 A Any fire protection sprinkler contractor who has qualified
6 and received a permit from the State Fire Marshal.

7 "(1)(3) FIRE PROTECTION SPRINKLER CONTRACTOR <u>I</u>. An 8 individual, partnership, corporation, association, or joint 9 venture engaged in the business of <u>layout</u>, installation, 10 repair, alteration, addition, maintenance, or inspection of 11 <u>all</u> fire protection sprinkler systems. This does not include 12 local building officials, fire inspectors, or insurance 13 inspectors when acting in their official capacity.

14 "(4) FIRE PROTECTION SPRINKLER CONTRACTOR II. An individual, partnership, corporation, association, or joint 15 16 venture whose business is limited to the execution of 17 contracts requiring the ability to layout, fabricate, install, 18 inspect, alter, repair, and service single family potable 19 water fire protection sprinkler systems for detached single 20 family dwellings and manufactured housing in accordance with the latest edition of NFPA 13D or ICC IPC Chapter 29 Section 21 22 P2904.

"(5) FIRE PROTECTION SPRINKLER SYSTEM. A <u>a. An</u>
<u>integrated</u> system of <u>underground and</u> overhead piping designed
in accordance with fire protection engineering standards. The
system is supplied from a reliable, constant and sufficient
water supply, such as a gravity tank, fire pump, reservoir or

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pressure tank, and/or connection by underground piping to a 1 2 city main. The portion of the sprinkler system above ground is considered the fire protection sprinkler system for purposes 3 4 of this chapter, and is a network of specially sized or 5 hydraulically designed piping installed in a building, structure, or area, generally overhead, and to which 6 sprinklers are connected in a systematic pattern. The system 7 8 includes a controlling valve and device for actuating an alarm when the system is in operation. The system is usually 9 10 activated by heat from a fire and discharges water over the 11 fire area. Fire protection sprinkler systems shall include the 12 following types: Wet-pipe systems, dry-pipe systems, pre-action systems, deluge systems, combined dry-pipe and 13 pre-action systems, antifreeze systems, and circulating closed 14 15 loop systems, all as defined in by the National Fire Protection Association Pamphlet, NFPA 13, Standard for the 16 Installation of Sprinkler Systems, latest edition $\overline{,}$ or National 17 18 Fire Protection Association Pamphlet NFPA 13D, Standard for 19 the Installation of Sprinkler Systems in One and Two Family 20 Dwellings and Mobile Manufactured Homes, latest edition. "b. A sprinkler system, as defined by NFPA 13D or 21 22 IRC Section P2904, which is appropriate for the protection 23 against fire hazards in single family dwellings and 24 manufactured homes, and does not include residential portions 25 of any other type of building or occupancy that is protected

- 26 by residential sprinklers in accordance with NFPA 13 or NFPA
- 27 <u>13R or other portions of a building that are protected in</u>

1 accordance with NFPA 13 or NFPA 13R as appropriate for areas 2 outside the dwelling unit. The system is supplied from a 3 reliable, constant and sufficient water supply, such as a 4 gravity tank, pump, reservoir or pressure tank, and/or 5 connection by underground piping to a city main.

6 "(6) SINGLE FAMILY DWELLING. Any detached dwelling
7 covered in the scope of the International Residential Code,
8 latest edition.

9 "(4)(7) STATE FIRE MARSHAL'S PERMIT. The form issued 10 by the State Fire Marshal to a <u>any certified</u> fire protection 11 sprinkler contractor upon application being approved and fee 12 paid. The permit shall be issued in the name of the <u>certified</u> 13 fire protection sprinkler contractor, with the name of the 14 certificate holder noted thereon.

15 "§34-33-2.

16 "The administration of this chapter is vested in the 17 State Fire Marshal who shall have the power <u>to make rules in</u> 18 <u>relation to weekly fire pump testing and</u> to set or make 19 changes in the amount of the <u>fee fees</u> charged as necessary for 20 the administration and enforcement of this chapter.

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"§34-33-4.

"(a) Any individual, partnership, corporation,
association, or joint venture desiring to engage in the
business of fire protection sprinkler contractor <u>I</u> shall
submit to the State Fire Marshal on standard forms provided by
the State Fire Marshal a completed application. The applicant
shall include a fee of \$100.00 one hundred twenty dollars

(\$120) when making the application. The applicant shall 1 2 designate in the application the name of the proposed certificate holder and provide written proof that such 3 individual has passed a competency test administered by the 4 5 National Institute for Certification in Engineering Technology (NICET) as a Fire Protection Layout Technician - Level III. A 6 7 copy of the NICET letter of notification that the proposed 8 certificate holder has passed the competency test shall be sufficient written proof. The State Fire Marshal, shall issue, 9 10 upon receipt of the application and fee, shall issue a State 11 Fire Marshal's Permit to a fire protection sprinkler 12 contractor I who has a current State Fire Marshal's Permit, or who produces evidence of having a current state permit from 13 another state, if such state shall have entered into an 14 agreement of reciprocity with the State of Alabama. 15 16 "(b) Any individual, partnership, corporation, 17 association, or joint venture desiring to engage in the

18 business of fire protection sprinkler contractor II shall 19 submit to the State Fire Marshal on standard forms provided by 20 the State Fire Marshal a completed application. The applicant shall designate in the application the name of the proposed 21 22 certificate holder and provide written proof that the 23 individual holds a valid master plumber certification issued 24 by the Alabama Plumbers and Gas Fitters Examining Board. The 25 applicant shall include a fee of one hundred twenty dollars 26 (\$120) when making the application. The applicant shall obtain a minimum of 32 hours of training on residential fire 27

1	sprinkler systems that adequately covers NFPA 13D or ICC P2904
2	provided by a third party agency approved by the State Fire
3	Marshal's office, pass the ICC Residential Fire Sprinkler
4	Design/Installation Test, be capable of producing plans for a
5	13D or P2904 Home Fire Sprinkler System, and provide proof of
6	insurance. The State Fire Marshal, upon receipt of the
7	completed and compliant application and fee, shall issue a
8	State Fire Marshal's permit to a fire protection sprinkler
9	contractor II. The State Fire Marshal, upon receipt of the
10	application and fee, shall issue a State Fire Marshal's Permit
11	to a fire protection sprinkler contractor II who produces
12	evidence of having a current state permit from another state,
13	if such state shall have entered into an agreement of
14	reciprocity with the State of Alabama.
15	" <u>(c) Prior to a certificate holder being issued a</u>
16	permit under this section to provide residential fire
17	protection sprinkler services, the certificate holder must
18	provide to the State Fire Marshal an active certificate of
19	insurance covering such work with a policy value no less than
20	one million dollars (\$1,000,000). The certificate holder must
21	complete a minimum of eight hours of CEU's in residential fire
22	sprinklers every year. Classes must be approved by the Alabama
23	State Fire Marshal's Office.
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"(a) If the required fee has been paid, satisfactory
written proof from NICET has been provided that the competency
test was passed when required by this chapter, <u>all of the</u>

requirements set forth in this chapter for obtaining the 1 requested permit have been met, and the proposed certificate 2 holder is found to be at present a responsible, managing 3 4 owner, partner, officer, or employee of the fire protection sprinkler contractor I, the State Fire Marshal shall, within 5 30 days, shall issue a State Fire Marshal's permit in the name 6 7 of the fire protection sprinkler contractor I with the name of 8 the certificate holder noted thereon.

"(b) If the required fee has been paid, satisfactory 9 10 written proof from ICC has been provided that the competency test was passed when required by this chapter, and the 11 proposed certificate holder is found to be at present a 12 responsible, managing owner, partner, officer, or employee of 13 14 the fire protection sprinkler contractor II, the State Fire Marshal, within 30 days, shall issue a State Fire Marshal's 15 16 permit in the name of the fire protection sprinkler contractor 17 II with the name of the certificate holder noted thereon. 18 "§34-33-6.

"In no case shall a certificate holder be allowed to 19 20 obtain a State Fire Marshal's permit for more than one fire 21 protection sprinkler contractor at a time. If the certificate 22 holder should leave the employment of the fire protection 23 sprinkler contractor, he or she must notify the State Fire 24 Marshal within 30 days. The certificate holder shall not be 25 eligible to obtain a State Fire Marshal's permit for more than 26 one other fire protection sprinkler contractor for a period of 27 12 months thereafter. If the certificate holder should leave

the employment of the fire protection sprinkler contractor, or 1 2 die, the fire protection sprinkler contractor shall have nine months to submit a new application proposing designation of 3 another individual as the certificate holder for the 4 5 applicant. If such application is not received and a new permit issued within the allotted time, the State Fire Marshal 6 7 shall revoke the permit of the fire protection sprinkler 8 contractor.

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"§34-33-7.

10 "The State Fire Marshal's permit shall expire 11 annually at midnight on September 30. At least 30 days prior, 12 the fire protection sprinkler contractor I or II must submit a 13 renewal application. A renewal fee must be submitted with the application. Failure to renew the permit prior to the 14 15 expiration shall cause the permit to be null and void as of 16 the expiration date, and it shall be unlawful under this 17 chapter for any individual, partnership, corporation, 18 association, or joint venture to engage in the business of 19 installing, repairing, altering, adding, maintaining, or 20 inspecting a fire protection sprinkler system without a valid 21 State Fire Marshal's permit. The permit may be reinstated by 22 making application as before, and payment of the fee; however, 23 until such time as a new permit is issued, it shall be 24 unlawful for the fire protection sprinkler contractor I or II 25 to engage in installing, repairing, altering, adding, 26 maintaining, or inspecting fire protection sprinkler systems. "§34-33-9. 27

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"Nothing in this chapter limits the power of a 1 2 municipality, county, or the state to regulate the quality and character of work performed by contractors a fire protection 3 sprinkler contractor I or II, through a system of permits, 4 5 fees, and inspections, which are designed to assure compliance with, and aid in the implementation of, state and local 6 7 building laws or to enforce other local laws for the 8 protection of the public health and safety. Nothing in this chapter limits the power of a municipality, county, or the 9 10 state to adopt any system of permits requiring submission to 11 and approval by the municipality, county, or the state, of 12 plans and specifications for work to be performed by contractors a fire protection sprinkler contractor I or II 13 before commencement of the work. If plans for a fire 14 15 protection sprinkler system are required to be submitted to and approved by any municipality, county, or the state (or 16 17 any departments or agencies thereof), the plans must bear the 18 permit number of the certified fire protection sprinkler 19 contractor or proof that the person, firm, or corporation that 20 designed such fire protection sprinkler system is an exempt owner under Section 34-33-3. The official authorized to issue 21 22 building or other related permits shall ascertain that the 23 fire protection sprinkler contractor I or II is duly certified 24 by requiring evidence of a valid State Fire Marshal's permit. 25 "§34-33-10.

"(a) This chapter also applies to any fire
 protection sprinkler contractor <u>I or II</u> performing work for

any municipality, county, or the state. Officials of any municipality, county, or the state are required to determine compliance with this chapter before awarding any contracts for the installation, repair, alteration, addition, or inspection of a fire protection sprinkler system. Bids for such shall be accompanied by a copy of a valid State Fire Marshal's permit.

"(b) All architects and engineers preparing plans 7 8 and specifications for work involving fire protection sprinkler systems to be contracted in the State of Alabama 9 10 shall include in their invitations to bidders and their 11 specifications a copy of this chapter or such portions thereof 12 as are deemed necessary to convey to the invited bidder, 13 whether he or she is a resident or nonresident of this state and whether a license has been issued to him or her or not, 14 the information that it will be necessary for him or her to 15 show evidence of license before his or her bid is considered. 16

"(c) A certified licensed engineer shall design the
 plans for any residential fire protection sprinkler system and
 approve any changes made to the system design."

20 Section 2. Nothing in this act is intended to 21 authorize the State Fire Marshal to require the installation 22 of any fire protection sprinkler system in any single family 23 dwelling.

24 Section 3. (a) The State Fire Marshal shall collect 25 and publish data on all <u>residential</u> structural fires in 26 Alabama in a report that includes all of the following 27 information:

(1) The type of structure. 1 2 (2) The age of the structure. (3) The code enforced when the structure was 3 4 constructed. 5 (4) The cause of the fire. (5) Whether the cause of the fire was the result of 6 7 a criminal or suspicious event. (6) The materials used in the construction of the 8 9 structure. 10 (7) The type and amount of damage to the structure. 11 (8) The type and number of functional smoke 12 detectors and fire sprinklers installed in the structure. 13 (b) (1) All information collected pursuant to this section shall be made available to the public, free of charge, 14 15 on the website of the State Fire Marshal. 16 (2) The information shall be recorded and published on a monthly basis and maintained thereafter in a sortable 17 18 electronic format on the website of the State Fire Marshal. Section 4. This act shall become effective on the 19 20 first day of the third month following its passage and 21 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
