9		established for enumerated state agencies. The
10		agencies are periodically reviewed by the Alabama
11		Sunset Committee. After the review process is
12		completed, the committee prepares its
13		recommendations for the agencies to the Legislature
14		in the form of sunset bills which either continue,
15		terminate, or continue with modification each
16		agency reviewed.
17		This bill would provide for the continuance
18		of the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners until
19		October 1, 2021, with the following change: To
20		delete conflicting language relating to the renewal
21		date of a license.

Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the existence and functioning of the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners until October 1, 2021, with certain modifications; to amend Section 34-24-165, Code of Alabama 1975, so as to delete conflicting language relating to the renewal date of a license.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

8 Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the 9 Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the State Board 10 of Chiropractic Examiners until October 1, 2021, with the 11 additional recommendation for statutory change as set out in 12 Section 3.

Section 2. The existence and functioning of the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners, created and functioning pursuant to Sections 34-24-120 to 34-24-177, inclusive, Code of Alabama 1975, is continued until October 1, 2021, and those code sections are expressly preserved.

Section 3. Section 34-24-165 of the Code of Alabama 19 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§34-24-165.

"(a) Every license to practice chiropractic or permit to own a chiropractic practice shall be subject to renewal on September 30 of the year for which it is issued with a grace period from October 1 to December 31 of each year. Every person having a valid license or permit may on or before September 30 renew the license or permit for the ensuing year by the payment to the State Board of Chiropractic

Examiners board of a fee of not more than four hundred dollars 1 2 (\$400), the exact amount to be fixed by rule of the board, adopted in accordance with the Alabama Administrative 3 4 Procedure Act, subject to the condition that no increase or 5 decrease in any one year shall exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25). The license renewal shall be accompanied by 6 7 satisfactory evidence that the person has completed during the preceding year a minimum of 18 hours of professional 8 educational work approved by the board. The permit renewal 9 10 shall be accompanied by satisfactory evidence that the primary 11 permit holder has completed the number of approved continuing 12 education hours in the manner set forth and required by rule of the board. The board, for good and reasonable cause shown, 13 may waive the education requirement. The secretary-treasurer 14 15 or the executive director of the board shall notify each 16 licensee or permit holder at least 30 days prior to September 17 30 of each year of the due date for renewal. In addition to 18 the renewal fee, a late renewal penalty shall be assessed any 19 licensee or permit holder who fails to pay the renewal fee by 20 September 30 of each year based on the following schedule:

21 "(1) For renewal during the month of October, one 22 hundred dollars (\$100).

"(2) For renewal during the month of November, two
hundred dollars (\$200).

"(3) For renewal during the month of December, threehundred dollars (\$300).

A chiropractor may continue to practice or a permit holder may continue to own a chiropractic practice until December 31 of the year for which a license or permit is issued subject to subsection (b).

5 "(b) Any license issued pursuant to this chapter shall be automatically suspended if not renewed on or before 6 7 January 1. Any chiropractor whose license is automatically suspended shall be reinstated if all conditions for renewal 8 have been satisfied and upon payment of a reinstatement fee on 9 10 or before January 31. Any chiropractor who seeks reinstatement 11 due to nonrenewal after the above time shall comply with Section 34-24-176. 12

13 "(c) Any licensee who is no longer in active practice may apply for retirement of his or her license by 14 15 submitting an affidavit to that effect on a form supplied by 16 the executive director. A licensee whose license is retired is 17 excused from the professional education requirement specified 18 in this article. The annual fee for maintenance of a retired 19 license may not be more than one-half of the amount required 20 by this article for an active license. Any license issued 21 pursuant to this section shall be automatically suspended if 22 not renewed on or before January 1. Any chiropractor whose 23 license is automatically suspended shall be reinstated if all 24 conditions for renewal have been satisfied and upon payment of 25 a reinstatement fee on or before January 31. Any chiropractor 26 who seeks reinstatement due to nonrenewal after the above time 27 shall comply with Section 34-24-176.

"(d) The board may waive or reduce annual 1 2 registration and the payment of fees while any licensee is prevented from practicing chiropractic by reason of physical 3 disability, temporary active duty with any of the Armed Forces 4 5 of the United States, or while any licensee is completely retired from the practice of chiropractic. The waiver of fees 6 7 shall be effective so long as the disability, temporary active duty, or complete retirement continues. 8

9 "(e) The State Board of Chiropractic Examiners board 10 shall make rules and regulations as necessary and proper for 11 effectuating or enforcing this article.

12 "(f) In addition to other requirements established 13 by law and for the purpose of determining suitability for reinstatement of a license to practice chiropractic, each 14 individual seeking reinstatement shall submit a complete set 15 16 of fingerprints to the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners 17 board and the board shall submit the fingerprints provided by 18 any such individual to the State Bureau of Investigations. The 19 fingerprints shall be forwarded by the State Bureau of 20 Investigations to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) 21 for a national criminal history record check. Costs associated 22 with conducting a criminal history background check shall be 23 borne by the individual seeking reinstatement. The State Board 24 of Chiropractic Examiners board shall keep information 25 received pursuant to this section confidential, except that 26 such information received and relied upon in denying 27 reinstatement may be disclosed as may be necessary to support

the denial. In addition to other requirements established by 1 2 law and for the purposes of determining suitability for renewal, the board, in its discretion, may require an 3 4 individual seeking renewal of a license to practice 5 chiropractic to submit a complete set of fingerprints to the 6 State Board of Chiropractic Examiners board. The board shall 7 submit the fingerprints provided by any such individual to the State Bureau of Investigations. The fingerprints shall be 8 forwarded by the State Bureau of Investigations to the FBI for 9 10 a national criminal history record check. Costs associated 11 with conducting a criminal history background check shall be 12 borne by the individual seeking renewal. The State Board of 13 Chiropractic Examiners board shall keep information received pursuant this section confidential, except that such 14 15 information received and relied upon in denying renewal may be 16 disclosed as may be necessary to support the denial. This 17 requirement also shall apply in the same manner to any person 18 who is not licensed as a chiropractor who applies for 19 reinstatement or renewal of his or her permit pursuant to 20 Section 34-24-123(b).

"(g) The board shall also establish an inactive license for persons who desire to be licensed in Alabama but who actually practice in another state. The annual fee for maintenance of an inactive license shall be one-half of the amount required by this section for an active license." Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the
 recommendations of the Sunset Committee as provided in
 Sections 1, 2, and 3.

Section 5. This act shall become effective
immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or
its otherwise becoming law.
