26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 41-9-593, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$41-9-593**.** 

"(a) The commission shall, upon its first meeting, shall elect from its membership a chairman and a vice-chairman chair and vice chair who shall serve for a period of one year. The vice-chairman vice chair shall act in the place of the chairman in his chair in his or her absence or disability.

Commencing October 1, 2014, the Secretary of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall serve as chairman of the commission. Upon its first meeting after the effective date of this act, the commission shall elect a chair as provided in this subsection.

"(b) The commission shall meet at such times as designated by the commission or by the chairman chair at the state capital or at other places as is deemed necessary or convenient, but the chairman chair of the commission must call a meeting four times a year at the state capital or main location of the ACJIC Alabama Justice Information Commission in the months of January, April, July, and October. The chairman chair of the commission may also call a special meeting of the commission at any time he or she deems it advisable or necessary. A quorum shall be a simple majority of the voting commission membership or their designees and all matters coming before the commission shall be voted on by the commission.

1	" <u>(c)</u> The commission will keep or cause to be kept a
2	record of all transactions discussed or voted on by the
3	commission.
4	"(d) Members of the commission and their designees
5	shall serve without compensation; except, that payment of
6	their expenses may be paid in accordance with the applicable
7	state travel regulations."
8	Section 2. This act shall become effective
9	immediately following its passage and approval by the
10	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
