BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) The Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA) shall make available to law enforcement agencies a searchable statewide database of residents of the state who have been issued a pistol permit. The database shall be for use by law enforcement officers when conducting a traffic stop and shall be searchable by either motor vehicle registration or driver's license number for the purpose of identifying if a car is registered to or being driven by a person to whom a pistol permit has been issued.

(b) After the effective date of this act, in addition to the requirements specified in Section 13A-11-75 of the Code of Alabama 1975, each applicant for a pistol permit shall provide a copy of his or her driver's license, if any, to the sheriff. If the applicant does not have a driver's license, the applicant shall certify that fact to the sheriff under penalty of perjury and provide to the sheriff an alternate form of government issued identification. The sheriff shall forward to ALEA the applicant's driver's license information or, if the applicant has no driver's license, a notation that the applicant has no driver's license and the form of government issued identification provided in lieu of

- the driver's license, in the format and manner prescribed by

 ALEA.
- 3 (c) Any state, county, municipal, or university law 4 enforcement agency may utilize the database upon its 5 implementation.
 - (d) ALEA may promulgate rules necessary to provide for the compilation of information and creation and implementation of the database. The database shall be implemented before January 1, 2018.

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Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
