amended, relating to income taxation of corporations, to 1 2 reduce the tax rate on the net income of corporations to five percent beginning with the calendar year 2015. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 4 Section 1. The following amendment to the 5 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and 6 7 shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in 8 accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution 9 10 of Alabama of 1901, as amended: 11 PROPOSED AMENDMENT 12 Amendment No. 212, as amended by Amendment No. 662, now appearing as Section 211.03 of the Official Recompilation 13 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is amended 14 to read as follows: 15 "Amendment No. 662. 16 17 "The legislature shall have power to levy and 18 provide for the collection of taxes for state purposes on 19 taxable income of corporations, from whatever source derived, 20 for the calendar year 1963 2019, or for any fiscal year beginning in the calendar year 1963 2019, and each year 21 22 thereafter, at a rate not exceeding five six percent. However, 23 the rate shall be six and one-half percent on taxable income 24 of corporations for the calendar year 2001, or for any fiscal 25 year beginning in the calendar year 2001, and each year 26 thereafter. All federal income taxes paid or accrued within 27 the taxable year by corporations shall always be deductible in

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computing income taxable under the income tax laws of this 1 2 state, provided that in the case of foreign corporations the amount of federal income tax deductible shall be in proportion 3 to income derived from sources within Alabama, to be 4 5 determined in accordance with such laws as the legislature may 6 enact. The increase in the corporate income tax rate to six 7 and one-half percent provided by this amendment shall be self-executing and shall require no enabling legislation. 8

9 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 10 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 11 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 12 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 13 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 14 state.

15 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 16 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 17 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 18 following description of the substance or subject matter of 19 the proposed constitutional amendment:

20 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 21 Alabama of 1901, to amend Amendment No. 212, as amended by 22 Amendment No. 662, to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now 23 appearing as Section 211.03 of the Official Recompilation of 24 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, relating to 25 income taxation of corporations, to lower the tax rate on 26 corporations beginning with the 2019 calendar year from 6 1/2 27 percent to 6 percent.
