(a) (1) Commencing on the effective date of 9 10 this act, any person employed as an adjunct or part-time 11 professor at a public 2-year community college, junior 12 college, technical college, or trade school shall receive 13 compensation at a rate of no less than 50 percent of the amount of compensation received by a full-time professor, 14 15 employed at the same institution, for teaching the same or a 16 similar course in the same field of study.

(b) No current employee of a 2-year public
institution of higher education shall be dismissed or have his
or her work hours or salary reduced as a result of this act.
