21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. Sections 2 and 4 of Act 1225, 1969
23	Regular Session (Acts 1969, p. 2297), as last amended by Act
24	2009-359 and Act 2015-23, is amended to read as follows:
25	"Section 2. Division Into Exempt and Classified
26	Services. All offices and positions of the city shall be
27	divided into the exempt service and the classified service.

The exempt service shall include: the positions of all elected officials to the city; the City Administrator/Clerk or the City Manager/Clerk; the positions of voluntary personnel and personnel appointed to serve without pay; the positions of consultants rendering temporary professional service; all positions involving seasonal or part-time employment; provided, however, such positions in the exempt service held by employees of boards and commissions may be placed in the classified service by resolution of the governing body, after favorable recommendation by such other board or commission, and the governing body in such resolution shall prescribe the conditions under which the employees holding such positions so transferred may acquire permanent status in such positions so long as such positions remain in the classified service. The classified service shall include all positions in the city service that are paid out of the general fund of the city and out of funds of boards and commissions whose employees are placed in the classified service, and which are not specifically placed in the exempt service; provided, however, the governing body may by resolution, pursuant to a recommendation by the boards, remove any position from the classified service and place it in the exempt service. Unless otherwise specifically provided or clearly implied, the provisions of this act shall apply only to the classified service.

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"Section 4. Organization of Board. The personnel program established by this act shall be administered by the

board. The board shall consist of three members with an 1 2 additional two members to be appointed upon the effective date of this amendatory act who are residents of the city 3 4 Tuscaloosa County and who shall be appointed by the governing body. No member of the board shall be employed by or be an 5 official of the city, nor hold any elective public office. The 7 composition of the board shall be designated as Place No. 1, Place No. 2, and Place No. 3. The person appointed as a member 8 of the board in Place No. 1 shall serve an initial term of two 9 10 years; the person so appointed for Place No. 2 and shall serve 11 an initial term of four years; the person appointed for Place 12 No. 3 shall serve an initial term of six years. Upon the 13 effective date of this amendatory act, two board members shall be added as Place No. 4 and Place No. 5. Place No. 4 shall 14 15 serve an initial term of two years and Place No. 5 shall serve an initial term of four years. The term of office for all 16 members after the initial term provided for that place shall 17 18 be six years. Vacancies occurring during the term shall be 19 filled for the balance of the term by the governing body. 20 Members of the board may, within the sole discretion of the 21 City Council of the City of Northport, be compensated for 22 their services, in such amounts and for such periods as the 23 City Council of the City of Northport shall choose; however, 24 funds shall be provided from the general fund of the city for 25 their reasonable and necessary expenses. The board shall elect 26 from its own members a chair, a vice chair, and a 27 secretary-treasurer. The board shall meet as often as

necessary to carry out the purposes of this act; however, the governing body shall have the right to control the appropriations to the board and to regulate the expenses of the board as it deems necessary. A majority of the members of the board shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and no action shall be taken without the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum present at a meeting. The board, with the approval of the governing body, shall have the right to engage such full-time or part-time personnel as shall be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act."

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
