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8	SYNOPSIS:	This bill would create the Alabama Memorial
9		Preservation Act of 2017.
10		This bill would prohibit the relocation,
11		removal, alteration, renaming, or other disturbance
12		of monuments located on public property.
13		This bill would prohibit any person from
14		preventing the governmental entity responsible for
15		maintaining the monuments from taking proper
16		measures to protect, preserve, care for, repair, or

A BILL

TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

To create the Alabama Memorial Preservation Act of 2017; to prohibit the relocation, removal, alteration, or renaming of monuments located on public property; to prohibit any person from preventing the governmental entity responsible for maintaining the monuments from taking proper measures to protect, preserve, care for, repair, or restore the monuments; to restrict the renaming of a school, street, bridge, building, park, preserve, or reserve which is located on public property; to create the Alabama Committee on Memorial Preservation; to provide for the membership of the committee; to provide for the duties of the committee; to authorize the committee to grant waivers and to issue orders; and to exempt certain art and artifacts, the Department of Transportation, local governments, universities, and utilities under certain limited circumstances.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the Alabama Memorial Preservation Act of 2017.

Section 2. For the purposes of this act, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- 3 (1) COMMITTEE. The Alabama Committee on Memorial 4 Preservation created by this act.
 - (2) CONTROLLING ENTITY. The governmental entity responsible for a monument or for the public property named for memorial purposes as provided in subsection (b) of Section 3.
 - (3) MONUMENT. An above-ground statue or marker that serves as a permanent memorial to an event, a person, a group, a movement, or military service that is part of the history of the state. For the purposes of this act, monuments do not include signage bearing historical or interpretive text, commonly known as a "historical marker" or "wayside exhibit," or portraits or plaques installed by temporary means.
 - (4) PUBLIC PROPERTY. All property owned by the State of Alabama, any county or municipal government in the state, or any other entity created by act of the Legislature to perform any public function.
 - Section 3. (a) No monument which is located on public property may be relocated, removed, altered, or renamed except as provided in Section 5.
 - (b) No school, street, bridge, building, park, preserve, or reserve which is located on public property and has been erected for, or named, or dedicated in honor or memory of an event, a person, a group, a movement, or military

- service and has held such status for more than 50 years may be renamed, except as provided in Section 6.
- Section 4. (a) There is created the Alabama

 Committee on Memorial Preservation.
- (b) The initial membership of the committee shall be 5 appointed no later than August 1, 2017. Thereafter, the membership of the committee shall be appointed and reappointed at the beginning of each legislative quadrennium. The 8 appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments to 9 10 assure committee membership is inclusive and reflects the 11 racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic 12 diversity of the state. The membership shall include all of 13 the following:
 - (1) One member appointed by the Director of the Alabama Department of Archives and History.

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- (2) One member appointed by the Executive Director of the Alabama Historical Commission.
- (3) One member appointed by the Chair of the Black Heritage Council.
- (4) One member appointed by the President of the Alabama Historical Association.
- (5) One member appointed by the President of the Alabama Trust for Historic Preservation.
 - (6) Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives from the membership of the House of Representatives.

- 1 (7) Two members appointed by the President Pro 2 Tempore of the Senate from the membership of the Senate.
 - (8) One member who is a county commissioner appointed by the Governor.

- (9) One member who is a mayor or city councilor appointed by the Governor.
- (c) At the organizational meeting of the committee, the membership of the committee shall select a chair and a vice chair. The chair of the committee may create advisory subcommittees and appoint members thereto, which may include members of the committee, representatives from governmental agencies, and members of the public with interest and expertise in the objectives of the committee. The committee shall create no more than two active advisory subcommittees at any given time unless the committee votes unanimously for additional subcommittees.
- (d) The committee shall thereafter meet at the call of the chair or any majority of the members thereof; provided, that the committee shall meet at least once each quadrennium. The committee shall have a continuing existence and may meet, act, and conduct its business at any place within this state during the sessions of the Legislature or any recess thereof, and in the interim period between sessions. All notices and meetings of the committee shall be conducted in accordance with the Alabama Open Meetings Act, Chapter 25A, Title 36, Code of Alabama 1975. A majority of the duly appointed members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.

1 (e) The committee shall perform all duties 2 prescribed by this act.

- (f) Each legislative member of the committee or any subcommittee, if created, shall be entitled to the legislative compensation, per diem, and travel as provided in Amendment 871 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 49.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.
- (g) The Alabama Department of Archives and History shall be custodian of the records of the committee.

Section 5. (a) Any controlling entity of public property on which a monument is located may petition the committee for a waiver from subsection (a) of Section 3 through an application including, at a minimum, all of the following:

- (1) A resolution adopted by the controlling entity seeking a waiver for the relocation, removal, alteration, or renaming of the monument, and stating the reasons therefor.
- (2) Written documentation, to the extent available from government records, newspapers, and other published and unpublished sources, of the monument's creation or dedication, including, if known, the person or groups advocating for the monument, their stated intent, and any subsequent alteration or renaming of the monument.
- (3) Written comments received, if any, by the controlling entity from members of the general public and members of any heritage, historical, genealogical, or

preservation organizations with interest in the controlling entity's waiver request.

- (b) If the committee grants a waiver, it may provide reasonable conditions and instructions to the controlling entity to ensure that the monument is preserved to the greatest extent possible.
- (c) In the event there is a need for emergency repairs or construction at the monument or on adjacent property, a controlling entity may temporarily relocate or otherwise protect the monument without seeking a waiver under the process set out in this section; provided the monument shall be returned to its prior location and condition as soon as safely and reasonably possible and no later than 120 days from the completion of repair or construction.
- (d) No person may prevent the controlling entity having responsibility for maintaining any of the monuments described in subsection (a) of Section 3 from taking proper and appropriate measures, and exercising proper and appropriate means, for the protection, preservation, care, repair, or restoration of those monuments.

Section 6. (a) Any controlling entity exercising control of public property on which a school, street, bridge, building, park, preserve, or reserve is located may petition the committee for a waiver from subsection (b) of Section 3 through an application including, at a minimum, all of the following:

(1) A resolution adopted by the controlling entity seeking a waiver for the renaming of the school, street, bridge, building, park, preserve, or reserve, and stating the reasons therefor.

- (2) Written documentation, to the extent available from government records, newspapers, and other published and unpublished sources, of the circumstances of the prior naming or dedication of the school, street, bridge, building, park, preserve, or reserve.
- (3) Written comments received, if any, by the controlling entity from members of the general public and members of any heritage, historical, genealogical, or preservation organizations with interest in the controlling entity's waiver request.

Section 7. (a) All applications for waiver submitted pursuant to this act shall be filed with the committee in care of the director of the Alabama Department of Archives and History. The committee shall have 90 days from the date the application is received in the office of the director to approve or deny the application by vote of the committee after a hearing conducted pursuant to the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act. The final decision shall be in writing and delivered to the controlling entity by first class mail. If the committee does not approve or deny the waiver application within 90 days of receipt of the application by the director, the waiver shall be deemed granted.

(b) If the committee denies the application for waiver, the controlling entity may file an appeal to the Circuit Court of Montgomery County for a de novo review of the application for waiver. The appeal shall be filed within 30 days of receipt of the written notice of denial.

Section 8. (a) If the committee determines after a hearing conducted pursuant to the Alabama Administrative Procedures Act that a controlling entity has removed a protected monument from public property without first obtaining a waiver from the committee pursuant to this act or from the Circuit Court of Montgomery County upon appeal, the committee may order the controlling entity to restore or replace the monument in like or similar fashion to the original. Notice of the order, setting out with particularities the grounds for issuance of the order, shall be delivered to the controlling entity by certified mail, return receipt requested.

(b) The controlling entity may file an appeal to the Circuit Court of Montgomery County for a de novo review of the order to restore or replace the monument. The appeal shall be filed within 30 days of receipt of the written notice of the order, and restoration or replacement of the monument shall be stayed pending a decision by the circuit court.

Section 9. This act does not apply to any of the following:

(1) Art and artifacts in the collections of museums, archives, and libraries.

(2) Monuments described in Section 3 that are located on public property under the control of, or acquired by, the State Department of Transportation, which may interfere with the construction, maintenance, or operation of any public transportation system or any roads or bridges under its control. The department shall strive to ensure that any such monuments are preserved to the greatest extent possible.

- (3) Monuments described in Section 3 that are located on public property under the control of, or acquired by, a county or municipal body or a university, which may interfere with the construction, maintenance, or operation of the public transportation system or any roads or bridges under its control. The governing body of the county, municipality, or university shall strive to ensure that any such monuments are preserved to the greatest extent possible.
- (4) Monuments described in Section 3 that are located on public property operated or used by a utility, which may interfere with providing utility service. The utility shall strive to ensure that any monuments are preserved to the greatest extent possible.

Section 10. The committee shall promulgate rules necessary to implement and administer this act. The rules shall be adopted pursuant to the Alabama Administrative Procedures Act.

Section 11. No controlling entity shall be found in violation of this act until the committee is fully constituted and the process for waiver application is fully in place.

Section 12. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
