25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. (a) An elector may vote in a primary
27	runoff election only if he or she voted in the preceding

primary election of the same political party for which the runoff election is being held.

- (b) The Secretary of State shall promulgate rules to implement this section that shall include, but not be limited to, procedures for making a list of who voted in each party primary available to each precinct election official working the polls during a runoff election.
  - (c) A precinct election official or member of the appointing board may not be held responsible for allowing or refusing to allow a voter to cast a ballot in a particular runoff election if he or she acts in good faith compliance with this section or the rules promulgated pursuant to this section.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
