19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. Section 45-37A-51.237, Code of Alabama
21	1975, is amended to read as follows:
22	"§45-37A-51.237.
23	"(a) Anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding
24	and except as provided in subsection (b), no retirement
25	benefits of whatever kind or description shall be payable to
26	any former participant for any period during which the former
27	participant is employed by the city, is due a salary from the

city or has been paid a salary by the city, except persons
elected by the people to serve the city shall have the option
of continuing to receive either retirement benefits or the
compensation for the office to which that person is elected,
or that person may choose to receive both such benefits and
compensation.

"(b) (1) For the purposes of this section, "retired public safety officer" means a retired law enforcement officer who was employed by the city or a retired firefighter who was employed by the city.

"(2) Notwithstanding subsection (a), a retired

public safety officer who was employed by the city may be

subsequently rehired by the city during times of critical

personnel shortages to provide public safety services as

provided in this subsection and may continue to receive

retirement benefits of whatever kind or description for any

period during which the public safety officer is reemployed by

the city.

- "(3) A retired public safety officer rehired by the city shall be retired for at least 45 consecutive days prior to reemployment with the city.
- "(4) The retired public safety officer shall not accrue additional retirement service credit for any portion of the period of reemployment.
- "(5) The retired public safety officer and the city shall make the contributions that would be required for members and employers under the system during the entire

1	period of subsequent employment, and the portion of the
2	contributions paid by the participant during the term of
3	reemployment is not refundable at the termination of the
4	subsequent employment period.
5	"(6) The period of reemployment for a retired public
6	safety officer pursuant to this subsection shall be no more
7	than a total of 10 years from the date of rehire by the city.
8	"(7) The chief of police or the fire chief shall
9	have the sole discretion to select retired public safety
10	officers for reemployment under this subsection pursuant to
11	the established guidelines of the Personnel Board of Jefferson
12	County.
13	"(8) a. The city may not employ a number of retired
14	law enforcement officers pursuant to this section that exceeds
15	10 percent of the city's entire authorized police force on the
16	effective date of the act adding this amendatory language.
17	"b. The city may not employ a number of retired
18	firefighters pursuant to this section that exceeds 10 percent
19	of the city's entire authorized firefighter force on the
20	effective date of the act adding this amendatory language.
21	"(9)a. The city shall employ retired law enforcement
22	officers only at ranks below sergeant and may not promote
23	subsequently employed retired law enforcement officers above

26	"b. The city shall employ retired firefighters only
27	at ranks below and may not promote subsequently employed

retired firefighters above the rank of apparatus operator at 1 2 any time during the subsequent employment." 3 Section 2. Prior to the implementation of this act, the city shall obtain an actuarial study certifying to the 4 5 governing body of the City of Birmingham that the act is cost 6 neutral to the retirement system of the city. 7 Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the 8 9 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law, and shall be 10 implemented only upon the passage of HB of the 2017 Regular

Session, amending Section 36-25-13, Code of Alabama 1975.

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
