21	sheriff in the county or any person appointed to serve as a
22	sheriff shall meet all of the following minimum
23	qualifications, in addition to any other qualifications
24	required by law:
25	(1) The person is a citizen of the United States.
26	(2) The person has been a resident of the county for
27	at least one year immediately prior to the qualification date.

- 1 (3) The person is qualified as an elector pursuant
 2 to state and federal law and the person has been registered to
 3 vote in the county at least one year immediately prior to
 4 qualifying.
 - (4) The person has been awarded a high school diploma or a GED equivalence.

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- 7 (5) The person is 21 years of age or older prior to qualifying.
 - (6) The person has three years of prior service as a law enforcement officer having the power of arrest.
 - (7) The person has never been convicted of a felony.
 - (b) Upon election, the sheriff of the county shall attend annually a minimum of 12 hours of continuing education approved by the Alabama Sheriff's Association or the National Sheriff's Association.
 - Section 3. This act shall not apply to or affect a supernumerary sheriff.
- Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
