BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE ()F ALABAMA :	•

Section 1. (a) Annual inservice training provided to teachers in the public K-12 schools shall include instruction on recognizing and avoiding inappropriate conduct and behavior with students. The State Superintendent of Education shall ensure that the instruction provided is uniform across the entire state, comprehensive, and includes, but is not limited to, information relating to physical, emotional, and electronic conduct and behavior.

- (b) The State Board of Education shall enter into contracts and cooperative agreements with private individuals, corporations, associations, and other organizations to provide the training required by this section. All contracts shall be let by competitive bid to the lowest responsible bidder who satisfies criteria established by the board.
- (c) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules as necessary to implement this section.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
