8 SYNOPSIS:

This bill would authorize a five percent surcharge on a retired person and a five percent surcharge on the employer of the retired person, such surcharge being based on the annual gross compensation of the retired person and distributed to the Retirement Systems of Alabama, when the person is retired under the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System and receives compensation for duties performed in any capacity, including as an independent contractor, for an employer participating in the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System, without suspension of the retirement allowance of the person.

This bill would require disclosure of the surcharge be provided to the retired person under certain conditions and would specify that the surcharge is nonrefundable and will not be credited to the retiree.

Relating to retirees under the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System; to authorize a surcharge on a retiree and an employer when a retiree performs duties for compensation in any capacity, including as an independent contractor, for an employer participating in the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System, without suspension of the retirement allowance of the retiree; and to require certain disclosures.

AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, commencing at the beginning of the next fiscal year following the effective date of this act, a surcharge based on the compensation a person who is retired under the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System receives for performing any duties in any capacity, including as an independent contractor, for an employer participating in the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System, without suspension of the retirement allowance of the person, shall be assessed on both the retired person and the employer.

(b) The surcharge authorized by subsection (a) shall be five percent of the annual gross compensation of the retired person and both the surcharge due from the retired

person and the surcharge due from the employer shall be paid in monthly installments to the Retirement Systems of Alabama in the same manner and at the same time as other monies are due the Retirement Systems of Alabama.

- (c) A written notice disclosing the surcharge required by this section shall be provided by the employer to the retired person at least 30 days prior to the date the employer knows or should know that a retired person will be performing duties for the employer, but if it is less than 30 days from the date the employee is scheduled to commence employment, the employer shall provide immediate written notice disclosing the surcharge required by this section.
- (d) (1) The notice required by this section shall be created by the Retirement Systems of Alabama and shall include a clear and concise statement informing the retired person that the surcharge to be collected from the compensation of the retired person will not benefit the retired person in any manner or language substantially similar to this subdivision that effectively communicates to the retired person that the surcharge is not a contribution or benefit for the retired person.
- (2) The initial notice shall be distributed to every employer that participates in the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System at least 40 days prior to the commencement of the initial collection of the surcharge.
- (3) Any modifications made by the Retirement Systems of Alabama to the notice required by this section shall be

distributed, with a date of when the modified notice will take
effect, to every employer that participates in the Employees'

Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System, at least
days prior to the effective date of the modified notice.

- (4) Upon receipt of a modified notice, the employer shall distribute copies of the modified notice to all retired persons employed at that time by the employer and shall use the most recent modified notice when disclosing the surcharge to potential employees who are retired persons.
- (e)(1) There shall be no service credit granted for any time period during which the retiree must pay the surcharge.
- (2) The surcharge shall not be credited to the retiree and shall not be refundable to the retiree or employer.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
