Under existing law, a person claiming to be the father of a child may acknowledge paternity and provide notice of intent to claim paternity by placing his name on the state putative father registry either before the child's birth or within 30 days after birth.

This bill would provide that if the mother of a child alleges a person to be the father of her child, either born or unborn, the alleged father is entitled to a paternity test. This bill would require the alleged father to prove that the mother, by spoken word or by publication, alleged him to be the father of her child.

This bill would provide for payment of the cost of the test.

6 AN ACT

To provide that if a woman alleges a person to be the father of her child, either born or unborn, the alleged father is entitled to a paternity test; to require proof that the mother, by word or publication, made the allegation; to provide for payment of the cost of the test; and to provide that this act shall not affect any right of a person to acknowledge paternity by placing his name on the putative father registry.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) If a woman alleges a person to be the father of her child, either born or unborn, the alleged father is entitled to a paternity test. The person requesting the paternity test shall prove that the mother, by spoken word or publication, alleged him to be the father. The person requesting the test shall pay the costs of the test.

(b) This section shall not affect the right of a person to acknowledge paternity or provide notice of intent to claim paternity by placing his name on the putative father registry established pursuant to Chapter 10C of Title 26 of the Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
