"(a) Any minor who is 14 years of age or older, or
has graduated from high school, or is married, or having been
married is divorced or is pregnant may give effective consent
to any legally authorized medical, dental, health, or mental
health services for himself or herself, and the consent of no
other person shall be necessary.

"(b) A minor who is 18 years of age or older may give effective consent to any legally authorized medical, dental, health, or mental health research for himself or herself, and the consent of no other person shall be necessary."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
