The term 11 includes child care centers, day nurseries, nursery 12 schools, pre-kindergartens, kindergartens, and play 13 groups, including those that are operated as part 14 of a private school if they provide care for more 15 than four hours a day. 16 Also under existing law, child care 17 facilities that are part of a church or nonprofit 18 religious school are exempt from licensing by the 19 Department of Human Resources. 20 This bill would establish the Child Care 21 Safety Act. 22 This bill would revise the definition of day care center to include preschools. 23 24 This bill would remove the exemption from 25 licensure for child care facilities that are part 26 of a church or nonprofit religious school by

requiring such facilities to be licensed by the 1 2 Department of Human Resources. This bill would clarify that the licensing 3 4 of a faith-based child care facility may not be construed to infringe upon the rights of the 5 facility to teach or practice a religion. 6 7 This bill would also revise the criminal history background information check required for 8 9 certain individuals. 10 11 A BILL 12 TO BE ENTITLED 13 AN ACT 14 15 Relating to child care facilities; to amend Sections 13A-6-29, 38-7-2, 38-7-3, 38-13-2, and 38-13-3, Code of 16 17 Alabama 1975; to establish the Child Care Safety Act; to 18 revise the definition of day care center to include 19 preschools; to remove the exemption from licensure by the 20 Department of Human Resources of preschool programs that are part of a church or nonprofit religious school; to clarify 21 22 that the licensing of a faith-based child care facility may 23 not be construed to infringe upon the rights of the facility 24 to teach or practice a religion; and to revise the criminal 25 history background information check required for certain individuals. 26 27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited
 as the Child Care Safety Act.

3 Section 2. Sections 13A-6-29, 38-7-2, 38-7-3,
4 38-13-2, and 38-13-3, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to
5 read as follows:

"§13A-6-29.

7 "(a) As used in this section, the following terms8 shall have the following meanings:

9 "(1) MEDICALLY PRESCRIBED. In accordance with a 10 physician's prescription or in accordance with age-appropriate 11 directions for the over-the-counter medication.

12 "(2) NEAR FATALITY. An act that, as certified by a13 physician, places the child in serious or critical condition.

14 "(b) There is established the crime of 15 administration of medication by the owner, operator, or 16 employee of a licensed or statutorily exempt child care 17 facility with the intent to drug the child or alter the 18 child's behavior beyond what is medically prescribed or with 19 the reckless disregard for the health, safety, and welfare of 20 the child.

21 "(c) A violation of subsection (b) is punishable as 22 follows:

"(1) A violation which does not cause or contributes
to the death, near fatality, dismemberment, or permanent
disability of a child is a Class C felony.

"(2) A violation which causes a near fatality,
 dismemberment, or permanent disability of a child is a Class B
 felony.

4 "(3) A violation which causes the death of a child5 is a Class A felony.

7 "Terms used in this chapter, unless the context 8 otherwise requires, have the meanings ascribed to them in this 9 section. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in 10 the present tense include the future, words in the singular 11 number include the plural number, and words in the plural 12 number include the singular number, and the word "shall" is 13 always mandatory and not merely directory:

"(3) CHILD-PLACING AGENCY. A public or private 8 child-care facility which receives, places, or arranges for 9 10 the placement of any child or children in adoptive or foster 11 family homes or other facilities for child care apart from the 12 custody of the child's or children's parents. The term "child-placing agency" includes, but is not limited to, all 13 agencies established and maintained by a municipality or other 14 15 political subdivision of the State of Alabama to protect, 16 quard, train, or care for children outside their own homes, 17 but does not include any circuit court or juvenile court or 18 any duly appointed juvenile probation officer or youth 19 counselor of the court who receives and places children under 20 an order of the court.

"(4) DAY CARE CENTER. Any child-care facility receiving more than 12 children for daytime care during all or part of a day. The term "day care center" includes, but is not limited to, facilities commonly called "child-care centers," "day nurseries," "nursery schools," "pre-kindergartens," "preschools," "kindergartens," and "play groups," with or without stated educational purposes. The term further

includes, but is not limited to, pre-kindergarten, preschool,
kindergarten, or nursery schools or other daytime programs
operated as a part of a private school and receiving children
younger than lawful school age for daytime care for more than
four hours a day, with or without stated educational purposes.
The term does not include any of the following:

7 "a. Kindergartens or nursery schools or other
8 daytime programs operated by public elementary systems or
9 secondary level school units or institutions of higher
10 learning.

"b. Kindergartens or nursery schools or other daytime programs, with or without stated educational purposes, operating no more than four hours a day and receiving children younger than lawful school age.

15 "c. Kindergartens or nursery schools or other 16 daytime programs operated as a part of a private school and 17 receiving children younger than lawful school age for four 18 hours a day or less, with or without stated educational 19 purposes.

"d. Facilities operated for more than four hours a day in connection with a shopping center or service or other similar facility, where transient children are cared for temporarily while parents or custodians of the children are occupied on the premises or are in the immediate vicinity and readily available. The facilities shall meet local and state fire and health requirements. "e. Any type of day care center that is conducted on
 federal government premises.

3 "f. Special activities programs for children of 4 lawful school age including, but not limited to, athletics, 5 crafts instruction and similar activities conducted on an 6 organized and periodic basis by civic, charitable, and 7 governmental organizations provided local and state fire and 8 health requirements are met.

9 "(5) DAY CARE HOME. A child-care facility which is a 10 family home and which receives not more than six children for 11 care during the day.

12 "(6) DEPARTMENT. The Department of Human Resources13 of the State of Alabama.

"(7) FACILITY FOR CHILD CARE or CHILD-CARE FACILITY. 14 A facility established by any person, group of persons, 15 16 agency, association, or organization, whether established for 17 gain or otherwise, who or which receives or arranges for care 18 or placement of one or more children, unrelated to the 19 operator of the facility, apart from the parents, with or 20 without the transfer of the right of custody, in any facility as defined in this chapter, established and maintained for the 21 22 care of children.

"(8) FOSTER FAMILY HOME. A child-care facility in a residence of a family where the family receives a child or children, unrelated to that family, for the purpose of providing family care or therapeutic family care and training,

or transitional living program services on a full-time basis.
 The types of foster family homes are defined as follows:

"a. Boarding home. A foster family home wherein the
foster family receives a child or children and receives
payment for their care. The number of children so received
shall not exceed six, unless the children are of common
parentage.

8 "b. Free home. A foster home which does not receive 9 payment for the care of a child or children and which may or 10 may not receive the child or children for the purpose of 11 adoption.

"(9) GROUP DAY CARE HOME. A child-care facility which is a family home and which receives at least seven but no more than 12 children for care during part of the day where there are at least two adults present and supervising the activities.

17 "(10) GROUP HOME. A child-care facility where at 18 least seven but not more than 10 children are received and 19 maintained for the purpose of providing them with care or 20 training or both, or transitional living program services.

"(11) MATERNITY CENTER. A facility in which any person, agency, or corporation receives or cares for one or more minor pregnant girls, except that the term does not include hospitals.

"(12) NIGHT CARE FACILITY. A child-care facilitywhich is a center or a family home receiving a child or

1 children for care during the night. A "night care facility" is
2 further defined as follows:

3 "a. Nighttime center. A facility which is
4 established to receive more than 12 children for nighttime
5 care.

6 "b. Nighttime home. A family home which receives no 7 more than six children for nighttime care.

8 "c. Group nighttime home. A child-care facility 9 which is a family home which receives at least seven but no 10 more than 12 children for nighttime care and where there are 11 at least two adults present and supervising the activities.

"(13) RELATED. Any of the following relationships by
blood, marriage, or adoption: Parent, grandparent, brother,
sister, stepparent, stepbrother, stepsister, half brother,
half sister, uncle or aunt, and their spouses.

16 "(14) TRANSITIONAL LIVING FACILITY. A child-care 17 facility or program that is designed to give opportunities to 18 practice independent living skills to eligible persons at 19 least 16 years of age and under 21 years of age in foster care 20 in a variety of residential settings with varying degrees of 21 care and supervision.

"No person, group of persons, or corporation may operate or conduct any facility for child care, as defined in this chapter, without being licensed or approved as provided in this chapter; provided, however, that nothing in this section or in this chapter prohibits an employee of the

department from carrying out the duties of the department as 1 provided in this title or infringes upon the religious 2 teaching or practices of a licensed faith-based facility for 3 child care. The computerized, automated 19 fingerprint identification system (AFIS) maintained by the 20 Department of Public Safety Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency that allows for a computer search of the in-state 21 22 database for criminal history background check information 23 maintained by the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center 24 (ACJIC). The system contains criminal history background 25 information for fingerprint-based and name-based searches.

"(5) CARE. The provision of care, treatment,
 education, training, instruction, supervision, or recreation
 to children, adults, or individuals with disabilities.

"(6) CARETAKER SETTING. A building, structure, or
location, public or private property, or vehicle, utilized for
or involved in the providing of care, education, training,
instruction, or supervision of children, adults, or
individuals with disabilities or transportation in connection
with activity provided by a licensed, approved, or certified
child or adult care facility.

"(7) CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER. The Commissioner of the Department of Human Resources, the director of a county department of human resources, or the head of an employer covered by this chapter, but not specifically enumerated.

15 "(8) CHILD or CHILDREN. An individual under 19 years16 of age.

"(9) CHILD CARE FACILITY. A person or entity holding
a Department of Human Resources license, permit, or approval
to provide child care, including foster care, under Chapter 7
of this title. The term excludes exempt child care facilities.

"(10) CHILD PLACING AGENCY. A person or entity
licensed by the Department of Human Resources under Chapter 7
of this title, issuing approvals to foster family homes and
adoptive homes.

25 "(11) CONVICTION. A determination of guilt as the 26 result of a plea, including a plea of nolo contendere, or a 27 trial.

"(12) CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND INFORMATION CHECK. 1 2 The review of any and all records containing any information 3 collected and stored in the criminal record repository of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Alabama Criminal Justice 4 5 Information Center, and the Alabama Department of Public Safety State Law Enforcement Agency involving an arrest or 6 7 conviction by a criminal justice agency, including, but not limited to, child abuse crime information as defined by 42 8 U.S.C. § 5119, the National Child Protection Act of 1993, 9 10 conviction record information, fingerprint cards, correctional 11 data and release information, and identifiable descriptions 12 and notations of convictions. Criminal history background 13 information shall not include any analytical records or investigative reports that contain intelligence information or 14 criminal investigation information. 15

16 "(13) CURRENT. An individual who is presently 17 employed, licensed, or approved, or working as a volunteer on 18 November 1, 2000.

"(14) DAILY LIVING TASKS. Activities of daily
living, including walking, working, learning, grooming and
hygiene, bathing, dressing, eating, cooking, cleaning,
shopping, transportation, managing money, maintaining a
residence, writing, and using telephones, computers, and other
automated communication devices.

25 "(15) ELDERLY. An individual 65 years of age or 26 older. "(16) EMPLOYEE. An individual currently in the service of an employer for compensation, full-time or part-time, and employed by contract or at will, in which the employer has the authority to control the person in the material details of how work shall be performed and when compensation shall be provided.

7 "(17) EMPLOYER. An individual, person, group of 8 persons, association, partnership, corporation, limited 9 liability company or partnership, business, or other entity 10 which hires employees, has volunteers, or contracts with 11 others to provide personnel to work with or provide care to 12 children, adults, or individuals with disabilities in a 13 caretaker setting.

"(18) ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS. The fundamental, not

19 Resources, or a child placing agency, including church day
20 care, child centers, or elder centers <u>adult care facilities</u>.

"(20) INDIVIDUAL. A natural person.

"(21) INDIVIDUAL WITH DISABILITIES. A person with a
 mental or physical impairment who requires assistance to
 perform one or more daily living tasks.

25 "(22) LAW ENFORCEMENT. The sheriff's department of a26 county or the police department of a municipality.

"(23) LICENSE. A license, permit, certification, 1 2 approval, registration, or other form of permission required 3 by law by whatever designation for a child care facility, adult care facility, child placing agency, foster parent or 4 5 foster home, adoptive parent or adoptive home, or any other person or entity in which an individual has unsupervised 6 7 access to children, the elderly, or individuals with 8 disabilities.

9 "(24) LICENSED SOCIAL WORKER. A social worker 10 licensed by the Alabama State Board of Social Work Examiners 11 to conduct family home studies and psychosocial assessments in 12 adoptive or custody cases by court order or for treatment not 13 otherwise required to conduct a criminal history check.

14 "(25) LICENSEE. Holder of a license or approval and 15 an adult household member whose residence is in the home in 16 regards to child care and adult care facilities in a home 17 setting.

18 "(26) PERSON or ENTITY. A natural person, sometimes referred to as an individual, an owner or operator of any 19 20 adult care facility, child care facility, child placing 21 agency, exempt child care facility, or licensee, whether an 22 individual, corporation, limited liability company or 23 partnership, partnership, association, or other legal entity 24 or group, and a board member, an officer, member, or partner 25 of an entity who has direct contact with children, the elderly, or individuals with disabilities in care. 26

"(27) REASONABLE SUSPICION. Belief by a prudent 1 2 person that reasonable articulable grounds exist to suspect 3 that the employee's past or present behavior should be reviewed to determine if such behavior or conduct bears upon 4 5 the individual's fitness to teach or supervise or have responsibility for the safety and well-being of children, the 6 7 elderly, or persons with disabilities as defined in this chapter. 8

9 "(28) REPORT. A written statement of criminal
10 history background information.

11 "(29) RESIDENCE. Place of abode, domicile, or 12 dwelling with intention to remain permanently and continuously 13 or for an indefinite or uncertain length of time.

14

"(30) SEX CRIME. Includes the following:

"a. Enticing a child to enter a vehicle, room,
house, office, or any other place for immoral purposes, as
proscribed by Section 13A-6-69.

18 "b. Incest, when the offender is an adult and the
19 victim is a minor, as proscribed by Section 13A-13-3.

20 "c. Kidnapping of a minor, except by a parent, in 21 the first or second degree, as proscribed by Section 13A-6-43 22 or Section 13A-6-44.

"d. Promoting prostitution in the first or second
degree, as proscribed by Section 13A-12-111 or Section
13A-12-112.

"e. Rape in the first or second degree, as
proscribed by Section 13A-6-61 or Section 13A-6-62.

- "f. Sexual misconduct, as proscribed by Section
 13A-6-65.
- 3 "g. Sexual torture, as proscribed by Section4 13A-6-65.1.

5 "h. Sexual abuse in the first or second degree, as 6 proscribed by Section 13A-6-66 or Section 13A-6-67.

7 "i. Sodomy in the first or second degree, as
8 proscribed by Section 13A-6-63 or Section 13A-6-64.

9 "j. Soliciting a child by computer for the purposes 10 of committing a sexual act and transmitting obscene material 11 to a child by computer as proscribed by Sections 13A-6-110 and 12 13A-6-111.

13 "k. Violation of the Alabama Child Pornography Act,
14 as proscribed by Section 13A-12-191, 13A-12-192, 13A-12-196,
15 or 13A-12-197.

16 "1. Any solicitation, attempt, or conspiracy to 17 commit any of the offenses listed in paragraphs a. to k., 18 inclusive.

"m. A crime listed in the Alabama Sex Offender
Registration and Community Notification Act, Chapter 20A of
Title 15.

"n. Conviction for a violation or attempted
violation of an offense committed outside the State of Alabama
or under federal law is a sex crime or any other crime if the
offense would be a crime in Alabama.

26 "(31) SUITABILITY CRITERIA.

- "a. Convictions for any of the following crimes 1 shall make an individual unsuitable for employment, volunteer 2 work, approval, or licensure: 3 "1. Murder, manslaughter, or criminally negligent 4 5 homicide. "2. A sex crime. 6 7 "3. A crime that involves the physical or mental injury or maltreatment of a child, the elderly, or an 8 individual with disabilities. 9 10 "4. A crime committed against a child. 11 "5. A crime involving the sale or distribution of a 12 controlled substance. "6. Robbery. 13 "7. A crime or offense committed in another state or 14 15 under federal law which would constitute any of the above 16 crimes in this state. 17 "b. Conviction for any crime listed in the Adoption 18 and Safe Families Act, 42 U.S.C. § 671(a) (20) shall disqualify 19 a person from being approved or continuing to be approved as a 20 foster parent or adoptive parent and a convicted person shall 21 be deemed unsuitable for employment, volunteer work, approval, 22 or licensure as a foster parent or adoptive parent. 23 "c. 1 "(32) SUITABILITY DETERMINATION. A decision that an 2 individual is or is not suitable for employment, volunteer 3 work, or licensure based upon the existence of a prohibited 4 criminal conviction.

5 "(33) UNSUPERVISED ACCESS TO A CHILD OR CHILDREN, THE ELDERLY, OR AN INDIVIDUAL WITH DISABILITIES. Contacts, 6 7 interviews, questions, examinations, interaction, or communications outside the presence, supervision, and control 8 of someone other than a child or elderly or disabled 9 10 individual in care during the provision of care, education, 11 training, instruction, supervision, or other employment or 12 license related activities.

"(34) VOLUNTEER. An individual who provides services without an express or implied promise of compensation, but shall not include the parent, family member, legal custodian, or legal guardian of a child, the elderly, or disabled individual in care.

18 "(35) WRITTEN CONSENT. A signed statement by the19 applicant or employee containing all of the following:

"a. The name, address, date of birth, race, gender, and Social Security number appearing on a valid identification document as defined in subsection (d) of 18 U.S.C. § 1028. If the applicant does not have a Social Security number because of sincerely held personal beliefs, the Social Security number shall not be required and the Department of Human Resources and the Department of Public Safety Alabama State Law <u>Enforcement Agency</u> shall provide an alternative means of

Unless 1 2 otherwise provided in this chapter, no criminal history background information check shall be conducted on a current 3 4 foster parent or household member of a foster family if a 5 Federal Bureau of Investigation and Alabama Department of Public Safety State Law Enforcement Agency criminal history 6 7 background information check has already been conducted under other law that meets the suitability criteria as provided in 8 this chapter. Subsequent arrests or convictions of foster 9 10 parents, or arrests or convictions entered into the automated 11 system subsequent to the initial report, shall be sent by the Department of Public Safety Alabama State Law Enforcement 12 13 Agency to the Department of Human Resources as provided in 14 this chapter.

15 "(3) An applicant or employee, with the exception of 16 those individuals on employed status on November 1, 2000, in a 17 position in the Department of Human Resources which requires unsupervised access to children, the elderly, or individuals 18 with disabilities as one of the essential functions of the 19 20 job. All current employees of the Department of Human Resources shall be subjected to a criminal history background 21 22 information check upon reasonable suspicion. Criminal history 23 background information checks shall be required for 24 prospective and current personnel under contract with the 25 Department of Human Resources or working with another entity 26 under contract with the Department of Human Resources, 27 students, mentors, and volunteers in positions requiring

unsupervised access to children, the elderly, or persons with
 disabilities as one of the essential functions of the job. The
 Department of Human Resources shall pay any fees related to
 checks required pursuant to this subdivision.

5 "(4) A current licensee or applicant for a license
6 through the Department of Human Resources to operate a child
7 care or adult care facility.

"(5) An adoptive parent applicant for a child 8 adoptive placement through the Department of Human Resources 9 10 or child placing agency and any Department of Human Resources 11 or child placing agency approved adoptive parent prior to 12 entry of a final decree of adoption. Unless otherwise provided 13 in this chapter, no criminal history background information check shall be conducted on a current adoptive parent or 14 15 household member of an adoptive family if a Federal Bureau of 16 Investigation and Alabama Department of Public Safety State Law Enforcement Agency criminal history background information 17 18 check has already been conducted under other law that meets 19 the suitability criteria as provided in this chapter. 20 Subsequent arrests or convictions of adoptive parents, or 21 arrests or convictions entered into the automated system 22 subsequent to the initial report, shall be sent by the 23 Department of Public Safety Alabama State Law Enforcement 24 Agency to the Department of Human Resources as elsewhere 25 provided in this chapter.

26 "(b) An employer, child care facility, adult care27 facility, the Department of Human Resources, or a child

placing agency may only request a criminal history background information check by its chief executive officer, or his or her designee authorized in writing and notarized, and law enforcement shall render assistance, including assistance in obtaining fingerprints required for submission of a request to the Department of Public Safety Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency.

"(c) Every employee, volunteer or applicant, for 8 9 employment or a volunteer position, licensee, Department of 10 Human Resources adoptive parent applicant or approved adoptive 11 parent, or applicant for a license to the Department of Human 12 Resources to operate a child care or adult care facility shall 13 submit two sets of fingerprints and sign a written consent to obtain the criminal history background information. 14 15 Fingerprints shall not be required when a disability prevents 16 a person from being fingerprinted. Disabilities preventing 17 fingerprinting include the loss of both hands, severe scarring 18 of all fingers, closed paralytic hands, and similar 19 disabilities. In cases involving disability, a written consent 20 to obtain available criminal history background information by name only shall be obtained. No one who fails or refuses to 21 22 give written consent or submit fingerprints necessary to 23 obtain criminal history background information may be 24 employed, allowed to perform volunteer or other work, approved 25 or issued a license, or allowed to retain a license or 26 approval by the Department of Human Resources, an employer,

child care facility, adult care facility, or child placing
 agency.

"(d) Child care facilities or adult Adult care 3 4 facilities exempt from Department of Human Resources licensing 5 shall not be required to comply with this chapter, but may voluntarily collect and forward two complete acceptable sets 6 7 of fingerprints, the written consent, and nonrefundable fee from applicants or employees to the Department of Public 8 Safety Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency to request a 9 10 criminal history background information check which shall be processed pursuant to this chapter. Licensed social workers 11 12 conducting home studies may also request a criminal history 13 background check which shall be processed pursuant to this chapter. Provided, however, if a license-exempt child care 14 15 facility operated as part of a church ministry or religious 16 school does not choose to comply with this chapter on a 17 voluntary basis, then the employee or prospective employee of 18 the child care facility shall request a criminal history 19 background check, and the request shall be processed in the 20 same manner as for other employees or applicants under the 21 provisions of this chapter. The Department of Human Resources 22 shall, prior to the disbursement of any subsidized child care 23 funds, require all employees and applicants of legally 24 operating child care facilities to submit verification of the 25 application for a criminal history background check and the 26 results thereof when obtained. Upon reasonable suspicion that the individual has a criminal conviction or has not had a 27

criminal history background check conducted, the Department of Human Resources shall have the right to require employees of license-exempt <u>child care or adult care</u> facilities to submit each application for a criminal history background check and the results thereof when obtained."

6 Section 3. A child care facility that is an integral 7 part of a church or nonprofit religious school shall be 8 licensed in accordance with Chapter 7, Title 38, Code of 9 Alabama 1975, no later than August 1, 2018.

10 Section 4. This act shall become effective 11 immediately following its passage and approval by the 12 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law, and the amendatory 13 language of Section 38-7-3, relating to a child care facility 14 that is an integral part of a church or nonprofit religious 15 school, shall become operative August 1, 2018.
