22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Section 16-1-49 is added to the Code of
24	Alabama 1975, to read as follows:
25	§16-1-49.
26	(a) If a local board of education provides
27	information on immunizations, infectious diseases,

medications, or other school health issues to parents and
guardians of students in grades K through 12, then all of the
following information about influenza disease and its vaccine
shall be included:

- (1) A description of causes, symptoms, and means of transmission.
 - (2) A list of sources for additional information.
- (3) Related recommendations issued by the Advisory

 Committee on Immunization Practices of the federal Centers for

 Disease Control and Prevention.
- (b) The Department of Education, in cooperation with the Department of Public Health, shall develop and make available the information about influenza disease and its vaccine to local school systems as required under subsection (a) in an efficient manner that may include posting the information on its website.
- (c) An employee of a local board of education shall be immune from civil liability for acts in conformance with this section in accordance with Section 36-1-12.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
