21	Relating to suicide prevention; to require the

24	or with other mental or emotional disorders.
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. As used in this act, the following words
27	have the following meanings:

(1) MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID. The initial help given to a person showing symptoms of mental illness or in a mental health crisis, including, but not limited to, severe depression, psychosis, panic attacks, or suicidal thoughts or behavior, until appropriate professional or other help, including peer and family support, can be engaged.

(2) PUBLIC SCHOOL EDUCATOR. A person who is required by law to maintain a professional educator's certificate issued by the State Department of Education and who is employed by a city or county board of education, the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind, or educational and correctional institutions under the control of the Department of Youth Services.

Section 2. (a) No later than the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year, the Department of Mental Health, in consultation with the State Department of Education, shall develop a mental health first aid training program for the training of public school educators in the detection of mental or emotional disorders in students. The training shall be conducted by an employee of the Department of Mental Health, or through a contract with persons approved by the Department of Mental Health to train employees as mental health first aid trainers, and shall provide public school educators with the skills necessary to identify and assist a student experiencing a mental health crisis until the student is able to obtain appropriate professional care.

1 (b) The mental health first aid training program
2 shall include all of the following:

- (1) Instruction in a five-step strategy for helping an individual experiencing a mental health crisis, including assessing risk, listening respectfully to and supporting the student, and identifying professional help and other supports for the individual.
- (2) An introduction to the risk factors and warning signs for mental illness and substance abuse problems.
- (3) The characteristics of the most prevalent mental or emotional disorders among children.
- (4) The identification of mental or emotional disorders.
- (5) Effective intervention strategies for students with mental or emotional disorders, including de-escalation techniques and positive behavioral interventions and supports.
- (6) An introduction on providing notice and referral to a parent or guardian of a student with a mental or emotional disorder so that the parent or guardian may take appropriate action such as seeking mental health services.
- (7) Experiential activities to increase public school educators' understanding of the impact of mental illness on students and families.
- (8) A presentation of evidence-based treatment and self-help strategies.
- (c) Not later than February 1 of each year, the State Department of Education shall provide the Legislature a

1 list of public school educators who have completed mental
2 health first aid training during the preceding calendar year.

(d) The State Department of Education shall promulgate rules to require public school educators to obtain up to 12 hours of mental health first aid training.

Section 3. The Legislature shall appropriate to the State Department of Education the amount necessary for the department to contract with the Department of Mental Health or persons approved by the Department of Mental Health to train employees of the Department of Mental Health as mental health first aid trainers to implement and provide mental health first aid training for public school educators.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
