8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the National Guard 9 Educational Assistance Act authorizes the Alabama 10 Commission on Higher Education to pay or reimburse 11 the tuition of any eligible active member of the 12 Alabama National Guard enrolled in an accredited 13 institution of higher education, technical college, 14 or junior college within the state and supplemental 15 educational assistance benefits are provided to 16 eligible active members of the Alabama National 17 Guard through the Alabama Commission on Higher 18 Education.

19 This bill would clarify that the tuition 20 assistance under the National Guard Educational 21 Assistance Act is available to the National Guard 22 Member regardless of whether he or she is enrolled 23 in and attending a public institution of higher 24 education, an accredited private institution of 25 higher education, or a partnership formed between 26 or among public and accredited private institutions 27 of higher education.

This bill would also provide that the 1 2 supplemental educational assistance benefits are available to the National Guard Member regardless 3 of whether he or she is enrolled in and attending a 4 public or accredited private community or junior 5 college, a public or accredited private institution 6 7 of higher education, or a partnership formed between or among public and accredited private 8 community or junior colleges or institutions of 9 10 higher education. 11 12 A BILL 13 TO BE ENTITLED 14 AN ACT 15 To amend Sections 31-10-3, 31-10-21, and 31-10-25, 16 17 Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the National Guard Educational Assistance Act and supplemental educational 18 19 assistance benefits for eligible active members of the Alabama 20 National Guard; to clarify and provide that the tuition assistance is available for members who are enrolled in and 21 22 attending a public institution of higher education, an 23 accredited private institution of higher education, or a 24 partnership between or among any of them; and to provide that 25 the supplemental educational assistance benefits are available 26 for members who are enrolled in and attending a public or 27 accredited private community or junior college, a public or

accredited private institution of higher education, or a partnership between or among any of them.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 31-10-3, 31-10-21, and 31-10-25
of the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
"\$31-10-3.

7 "The Alabama Commission on Higher Education is hereby authorized to pay or reimburse the tuition for any 8 active member of the Alabama National Guard who is enrolled in 9 10 a program leading to the associate, baccalaureate, masters, or 11 doctorate degree in <del>an</del> a public or private accredited 12 institution of higher learning, technical college, or junior college within the State of Alabama, or a partnership formed 13 14 between or among any of them. To be eligible for such benefits, the individual, at the time of his or her enrollment 15 must shall be a member of the Alabama National Guard in good 16 17 standing and a member of a federally recognized unit of the 18 Alabama National Guard. The member must shall be at least 17 19 years of age and must shall be a resident of the State of 20 Alabama. The tuition grant authorized under this article may 21 be used for undergraduate or graduate studies. In no event 22 will shall any individual be eligible to receive more than 10023 percent of covered expenses when combined with similar federal 24 veterans' educational benefits available to members of the 25 National Guard. All applicants for a tuition grant shall 26 complete a Free Application for Student Financial Aid (FAFSA). 27 No person shall be eligible for a tuition grant for more than

1 12 years after the date of the first tuition payment to him or 2 her under this article. For degrees above the baccalaureate, 3 only 10 percent of the total funds of the benefit program are 4 to be utilized. The Alabama Commission on Higher Education 5 shall set up minimum standards for performance that <u>must shall</u> 6 be met in order to maintain eligibility for the continuation 7 of the receipt of tuition grants under this article.

"§31-10-21.

"(a) Any active member of the Alabama National Guard 9 10 who has successfully completed advanced individual training or 11 commissioning shall be entitled to the tuition benefits 12 provided by this article upon his or her enrollment in a 13 degree objective in any accredited private junior or technical college or community or junior college that is under the 14 15 authority of the State Board of Education Alabama Community 16 College System, or enrollment in pursuit of his or her first 17 undergraduate degree objective in any public or accredited 18 private college or university within the state, or any 19 partnership formed between or among any of them. Certification 20 and eligibility for the tuition benefits provided by this 21 article shall be determined by the State Education Services 22 Office of the Alabama National Guard which shall promulgate 23 and implement administrative rules and procedures that it 24 deems necessary to carry out and monitor the tuition benefits 25 provided by this article.

26 "(b) Any active member of the Alabama National Guard27 who enrolls utilizing the tuition benefits provided by this

article shall complete the requirements for an undergraduate 1 degree no later than 10 years from the date of initial 2 enrollment or the active member shall be responsible for all 3 4 costs of any further studies required to attain his or her 5 degree. Active The active member must shall currently have and maintain an overall C average, or the grade point equivalent 6 7 thereof, at the end of each term. Failure to do so shall result in the termination of the tuition benefits provided by 8 this article. If a student withdraws, declares academic 9 10 bankruptcy, or is granted a grade waiver through a forgiveness 11 program, he or she is responsible for paying back that portion 12 of tuition and fees the state paid on his or her behalf.

"(c) Each educational institution that enrolls an 13 active member of the Alabama National Guard who is eligible 14 for the tuition benefits provided by this article shall take 15 16 necessary action to insure that the active member is aware of 17 all benefits that he or she may be entitled to under the 18 Montgomery G.I. Bill, any other VA educational benefits, any 19 student grant or scholarship, the Active Duty Tuition 20 Assistance Program, and the Alabama National Guard Education Assistance Program. In order to receive the tuition benefits 21 22 provided by this article, the active member of the Alabama 23 National Guard shall take the necessary steps to utilize all 24 of the above benefits.

26 "The Alabama Commission on Higher Education shall
27 serve as fiscal agent. Each institution shall submit to the

Alabama Commission on Higher Education a copy of the guard 1 2 member's completed application which shall serve as a basis of 3 payment. Neither ACHE nor the public or private institutions shall pay nor be held responsible for tuition benefits to 4 5 otherwise eligible students in the Alabama National Guard Education Assistance Program which are in excess of available 6 7 appropriations. The tuition benefits of this program shall be 8 mandated only to the extent that funds are appropriated by the 9 Legislature for the program."

10 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 11 first day of the third month following its passage and 12 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
