20	AN ACT
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22	To amend Section 34-25A-5 of the Code of Alabama
23	1975, relating to the Board of Prosthetists and Orthotists, to
24	further provide for certain temporary exemptions for persons
25	licensed in another state.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 34-25A-5 of the Code of Alabama
 1975, is amended to read as follows:

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"§34-25A-5.

4 "(a) Except as provided in subsection (h) or (i), no
5 person shall administer prosthetic, orthotic, or pedorthic
6 care in this state unless licensed or registered to do so in
7 accordance with this chapter. The board shall issue approved
8 forms for application prior to January 1, 2003.

9 "(b) In order to obtain a license as a prosthetist, 10 orthotist, or prosthetist/orthotist in this state, an 11 applicant shall be a citizen of the United States or, if not a 12 citizen of the United States, a person who is legally present 13 in the United States with appropriate documentation from the 14 federal government, and shall do the following:

15 "(1) File a written application on forms to be 16 developed and approved by the board. The applicant shall meet 17 at least one of the following requirements after a one-year 18 grandfather period:

19 "a. The applicant shall possess a baccalaureate 20 degree in orthotics and prosthetics from a college or 21 university accredited by a regional accrediting agency and 22 complete 1,900 hours per discipline sought of directed 23 employment under the supervision of a certified/licensed 24 prosthetist, a certified/licensed orthotist or a 25 certified/licensed prosthetist/orthotist in an accredited 26 facility, and be certified as a prosthetist, orthotist, or 27 prosthetist/orthotist by a nationally recognized certifying

board in orthotics and prosthetics accredited by the National
 Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA), or such other
 national agency as approved by the board, in the discipline or
 disciplines for which the application is made.

5 "b. The applicant shall possess a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited college or university and 6 have successfully completed a post-baccalaureate certificate 7 8 course approved by the board and completed 1,900 hours of directed employment per discipline in which license is sought 9 10 under the supervision of a certified/licensed prosthetist, a certified/licensed orthotist, or a certified/licensed 11 12 prosthetist/orthotist in an accredited facility, and be 13 certified by a nationally recognized certifying board in prosthetics or orthotics accredited by the National Commission 14 for Certifying Agencies (NCCA), or such other national agency 15 16 as approved by the board, in the discipline or disciplines for 17 which application is made.

"c. The applicant shall possess an associate's 18 19 degree from a regionally accredited college or university, 20 junior college, or community college and have successfully 21 completed postsecondary coursework in anatomy, physiology, 22 physics, biology, chemistry, algebra, and calculus and have 23 worked under the supervision of a certified/licensed 24 prosthetist, a certified/licensed orthotist, or a 25 certified/licensed prosthetist/orthotist for not less than 26 four consecutive years of the past six years in an accredited 27 facility, and be certified by a nationally recognized

certifying board in prosthetics or orthotics accredited by the
 National Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA), or such
 other national agency as may be approved by the board.

"d. The applicant shall have successfully completed 4 5 postsecondary coursework in anatomy, physiology, physics, biology, chemistry, algebra, and calculus and have worked 6 7 under the supervision of a certified/licensed prosthetist, a 8 certified/licensed orthotist, or a certified/licensed prosthetist/orthotist for not less than eight years of the 9 10 last 12 years and be certified as a prosthetist, orthotist, or 11 prosthetist/orthotist by a nationally recognized board 12 accredited by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies 13 (NCCA), or such national agency as may be approved by the board, in the discipline or disciplines for which application 14 15 is made.

16 "(2) Any applicant after the first year following 17 the board's issuance of applications shall meet the 18 requirements of subdivision (1) of subsection (b) prior to 19 receiving a license as a prosthetist, an orthotist, or a 20 prosthetist/orthotist.

"(c) In order to obtain a license as a pedorthist in this state, an applicant shall be a citizen of the United States or, if not a citizen of the United States, a person who is legally present in the United States with appropriate documentation from the federal government, and shall file a written application on forms to be developed and approved by the board. Applicants shall be in good standing as a certified

pedorthist with an entity accredited by the National
 Commission for Certifying Agencies.

3 "(d) In order to obtain registration as an orthotic 4 supplier, an applicant shall be a citizen of the United States 5 or, if not a citizen of the United States, a person who is 6 legally present in the United States with appropriate 7 documentation from the federal government, and shall do the 8 following:

9 "(1) File a written application on forms to be 10 developed and approved by the board. Such forms shall require 11 personal information such as full name, current address, 12 educational status and history, and work history for the last 13 five years of employment.

14 "(2) The application forms shall be accompanied, 15 when submitted, by attestation of employment by or contractual 16 relationship with a manufacturer of orthoses or orthosis 17 components whether registered with the United States Food and 18 Drug Administration or not. Attestation shall be by notarized 19 statement signed by the president, chief operating officer, or 20 other designated corporate official of the employing company.

"(e) The board shall grant a license without an examination for those qualified applicants who apply within one year of the issuance of application forms by the board. For purposes of this subsection, qualified applicants are those who possess current credentials as a Certified Prosthetist, Certified Orthotist, or Certified Prosthetist/Orthotist issued by the American Board for

Certification in Orthotics and Prosthetics, Incorporated, or
 the Board for Orthotist/Prosthetist Certification as a
 prosthetist, orthotist, or prosthetist/orthotist.

"(f) The board may issue a 12-month temporary
license as a prosthetist, an orthotist, a pedorthist, or a
prosthetist/orthotist to persons who have applied for
licensure and are awaiting examination. The temporary license
is renewable once for a six-month period if the applicant
fails to pass the examination at the first sitting.

10 "(g) The board shall grant a license as a 11 prosthetist, an orthotist, a prosthetist/orthotist, or 12 pedorthist to an applicant in possession of a current license 13 as a prosthetist, orthotist, prosthetist/orthotist, or pedorthist in another state or territory of the United States 14 without examination if the board determines that the 15 credentialing standards set by the other state or territory 16 17 are substantially equivalent to the standards set by the board 18 for this state.

19 "(h) No person may represent himself or herself as a 20 licensed prosthetist, licensed orthotist, licensed 21 prosthetist/orthotist, or licensed pedorthist, use a title or 22 description of services, or engage in the practice of 23 prosthetics, orthotics, or pedorthics without applying for 24 licensure, meeting the required qualifications, and being 25 licensed by the board unless otherwise exempted by this 26 chapter. A person not licensed with the board may not 27 represent himself or herself as being so licensed and may not

use, in connection with his or her name, the words licensed 1 2 orthotist, orthotist, licensed prosthetist, prosthetist, 3 licensed prosthetist/orthotist, prosthetist/orthotist, licensed pedorthist, pedorthist, licensed orthotic fitter, 4 5 orthotic fitter, licensed mastectomy fitter, mastectomy fitter, licensed therapeutic shoe fitter, therapeutic shoe 6 fitter, or letters "L.O.," "L.P.," "L.P.O.," "L.O.A.," "LPed," 7 "L.P.A.," "L.P.O.A.," "L.M.F.," "L.O.F.," "L.T.S.F." or other 8 letters, words, signs, numbers, or insignia indicating or 9 10 implying that he or she is either a licensed prosthetist, a 11 licensed orthotist, a licensed prosthetist/orthotist, a 12 licensed pedorthist, a licensed mastectomy fitter, a licensed therapeutic shoe fitter, or a licensed orthotic fitter in the 13 State of Alabama without first having a valid license. The 14 15 license shall be posted in a conspicuous location at the person's work site. 16

17 "(i) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to18 prohibit or restrict the following:

"(1) The practice of prosthetics, orthotics, or pedorthics by individuals authorized and performing services within their authorized scopes of practice as adopted by the State of Alabama Legislature including, but not limited to, authorized health care practitioners, doctors of podiatry, chiropractors, physical therapists, and occupational therapists licensed in this state.

"(2) The practice of prosthetics, orthotics, or
pedorthics by an individual employed by, or in the service of

the government of the United States of America while engaged in the performance of duties prescribed by the laws of the United States of America.

"(3) The practice of prosthetics, orthotics, or
pedorthics by any person not licensed as a prosthetist,
orthotist, prosthetist/orthotist, orthotic fitter, therapeutic
shoe fitter, or pedorthist in accordance with this chapter who
is employed in a hospital, rehabilitation facility, or
authorized health care practitioner's office under the
direction of an authorized health care practitioner.

"(4) A person fulfilling the supervised residency or
 internship experience requirements described in this chapter.

13 "(5) A person who meets the qualifications listed in subdivision (1) of subsection (b) from performing prosthetic, 14 15 orthotic, or pedorthic services in this state, provided the 16 services are not performed for more than 60 days per 12-month 17 period, after notification to the board. The practice of 18 prosthetics, orthotics, or pedorthics by a clinician who is 19 certified or licensed in another state at meetings of the 20 Alabama Prosthetic & Orthotic Association (APOA) or similar organizations or at training events approved by the board to 21 provide clinical services performed by a certified or licensed 22 23 clinician.

24 "(6) The practice of pharmacy by an individual25 subject to Chapter 23 of this title."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
