24	Relating to juries, to provide an exemption from

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Section 1. (a) A person 70 years of age or older may be excused from being called to jury service upon request to the jury commission in the county in which he or she is requested to serve.

- (b) (1) The Administrative Office of Courts shall adopt an exemption form to be used when a person 70 years of age or older requests exemption from jury service. Any qualified juror may file the form with the appropriate jury commission who may exempt the person from jury duty for a period of three years. Upon the expiration of the three-year period, a qualified juror may request to be re-exempted.
- (2) A person who has been removed from the master list pursuant to subdivision (1) may request to be reinstated on the master list provided that he or she satisfies the qualifications required by Article 2A, Chapter 16, Title 12, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 2. This act shall become effective 120 days following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
