8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, a law enforcement
9 officer who investigates a traffic accident must

This bill would require every fatality resulting from a traffic accident to be investigated by a county, municipal, or state law enforcement officer certified as a traffic homicide investigator by the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA).

This bill would provide that if a fatality resulting from a traffic accident occurs in a county or municipality that does not have a certified traffic homicide investigator, a neighboring county or municipality may provide a certified traffic homicide investigator for the investigation at no cost to the other county or municipality and would provide that if a certified traffic homicide investigator is not provided by a neighboring county or municipality, ALEA shall

provide a certified traffic homicide investigator
at no cost to the county or municipality.

This bill would provide general training requirements for the certification of a traffic homicide investigator.

This bill would also provide the Secretary of ALEA with rulemaking authority to implement this act.

TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

To require every fatality resulting from a traffic accident to be investigated by a law enforcement officer certified as a traffic homicide investigator by the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency; to provide that if a fatality resulting from a traffic accident occurs in a county or municipality that does not have a certified traffic homicide investigator, a neighboring county or municipality may provide a certified traffic homicide investigator for the investigation at no cost to the other county or municipality, and that if a certified traffic homicide investigator is not provided by a neighboring county or municipality, the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall provide a certified traffic homicide investigator at no cost to the county or municipality; to provide general training requirements for the

certification of a traffic homicide investigator; and to provide the Secretary of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency with rulemaking authority to implement this act.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Every fatality arising out of a traffic accident shall be investigated by a state, county, or municipal law enforcement officer, as appropriate, who is certified as a traffic homicide investigator by the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA).

- (b) A certified traffic homicide investigator shall be trained in all of the following:
 - (1) Crime scene management.
 - (2) Roadway mark identification.
 - (3) Crime scene measurement.
 - (4) Scale diagramming.
 - (5) Evidence collection.
 - (6) Post-crash vehicle inspection.
- 18 (7) Speed analysis.

- (c) (1) If a fatality resulting from a traffic accident occurs in a county or municipality that does not have a certified traffic homicide investigator, a neighboring county or municipality may provide a certified traffic homicide investigator for the investigation at no cost to the other county or municipality.
 - (2) If a certified traffic homicide investigator is not provided pursuant to subdivision (1), ALEA shall provide a

certified traffic homicide investigator at no cost to the 1 county or municipality. 2 (d) The Secretary of ALEA may adopt rules to 3 implement this act. 4 Section 2. This act shall become effective on 5 January 1, 2018, following its passage and approval by the 6 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
