23	Section 1. (a) This act shall be known and cited as

25	(b) Upon request of a law enforcement agency, a
26	wireless communications service provider shall provide call
27	location information concerning the telecommunications device

of a user to the requesting law enforcement agency. A law
enforcement agency may not request information under this
section unless the request is made for the purpose of
responding to a call for emergency services or in an emergency
situation that involves the possible risk of death or serious
physical harm.

- (c) A wireless communications service provider may establish protocols by which the carrier voluntarily discloses call location information.
- (d) A wireless communications service provider who provides information regarding call location or any other person for providing call location information is immune from civil liability if acting in good faith and pursuant to this section.
- (e) Pursuant to this section or as authorized by Section 15-5-40, Code of Alabama 1975, law enforcement may monitor from any location in this State location information obtained from a wireless communications provider or device from anywhere the device is located regardless of jurisdiction, subject to any limitation or prohibition provided by federal law.
- (f) The Alabama Law Enforcement Agency shall obtain contact information from all wireless service providers authorized to do business in this state to facilitate a request from a law enforcement agency for call location information under this section. The bureau shall disseminate

the contact information to each state and local law
enforcement agency in this state.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and
approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
