27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 36-7-22 of the Code of Alabama
1975, is amended to read as follows:

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"§36-7-22.

"Persons traveling on official business for the 4 5 state or any of its Legislative, Executive, and Judicial Branches, departments, institutions, boards, bureaus, 6 7 commissions, councils, committees, or other like agencies in privately owned vehicles shall receive an amount equal to 8 three-fourths of the mileage rate allowed by the Internal 9 10 Revenue Code for income tax deductions per mile in lieu of 11 actual expenses for transportation. Reimbursement shall be 12 made no later than 30 calendar days from the date the request 13 for reimbursement is initially received by the appropriate authority. For purposes of this section, travel, excluding 14 15 members of the Legislature, means a departure from the 16 permanent place of employment."

17 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 18 first day of the third month following its passage and 19 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
