To amend Section 34-25-22, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to applications for licensure as a polygraph examiner; to additionally require an applicant to provide two sets of fingerprints to the Board of Polygraph Examiners to forward to the State Bureau of Investigations for a state and national background check of the applicant; to require an applicant to give written consent to release the results of the background checks to the Board of Polygraph Examiners; and to require the applicant to bear the costs of the background checks.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 34-25-22, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$34-25-22.

"(a) Applications for original license shall be made to the board in writing under oath on forms prescribed by the board and shall be accompanied by the required fee, which is not refundable. Any such application shall require such information as in the judgment of the board will enable it to pass on the qualifications of the applicant for a license.

"(b) An applicant shall provide the board with two complete sets of fingerprints to be sent to the State Bureau of Investigation to conduct a criminal history background check. The State Bureau of Investigations shall forward a copy of the applicant's prints to the Federal Bureau of Investigations for a national criminal background check.

1	"(c) The request to the board shall contain the
2	<pre>following information:</pre>
3	"(1) Two complete functional sets of fingerprints,
4	either cards or electronic, properly executed by a criminal
5	justice agency or an individual properly trained in
6	fingerprinting techniques.
7	"(2) Written consent from the applicant for the
8	release of criminal history background information to the

10	"(d) The applicant shall pay all costs associated
11	with the background checks required by this section.
