each firefighter paramedic or firefighter emergency medical technician licensed by the State of Alabama and employed by the state or a county or municipality within the state, operating on-duty in direct support of a tactical law enforcement unit; to provide medical services, contingency planning, and operational weapon support.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

8 Section 1. Section 6-5-338 of the Code of Alabama 9 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§6-5-338.

11 "(a) Every peace officer and tactical medic, except 12 constables, who is employed or appointed pursuant to the 13 Constitution or statutes of this state, whether appointed or 14 employed as such a peace officer or tactical medic by the state or a county or municipality thereof, or by an agency or 15 16 institution, corporate or otherwise, created pursuant to the 17 Constitution or laws of this state and authorized by the 18 Constitution or laws to appoint or employ police officers or 19 other peace officers or tactical medics, and whose duties 20 prescribed by law, or by the lawful terms of their employment 21 or appointment, include the enforcement of, or the 22 investigation and reporting of violations of, the criminal 23 laws of this state, and who is empowered by the laws of this 24 state to execute warrants, to arrest and to take into custody 25 persons who violate, or who are lawfully charged by warrant, 26 indictment, or other lawful process, with violations of, the 27 criminal laws of this state, shall at all times be deemed to

be officers of this state, and as such shall have immunity from tort liability arising out of his or her conduct in performance of any discretionary function within the line and scope of his or her law enforcement duties.

5 "(b) This section is intended to extend immunity 6 only to peace officers and governmental units or agencies 7 authorized to appoint peace officers. No immunity is extended 8 hereby to any private non-governmental person or entity, 9 including any private employer of a peace officer during that 10 officer's off-duty hours.

11 "(c) Every private, non-governmental person or 12 entity who employs a peace officer or tactical medic during that officer's "off-duty" hours to perform any type of 13 security work or to work while in the uniform of a peace 14 officer shall have in force at least \$100,000 of liability 15 16 insurance, which insurance must indemnify for acts the 17 "off-duty" peace officer takes within the line and scope of 18 the private employment. The failure to have in force the 19 insurance herein required shall make every individual 20 employer, every general partner of a partnership employer, 21 every member of an unincorporated association employer, and 22 every officer of a corporate employer individually liable for 23 all acts taken by an "off-duty" peace officer within the line 24 and scope of the private employment.

"(d) The term "tactical medic," as used in this
section, means a firefighter paramedic or firefighter
emergency medical technician licensed by the State of Alabama

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and employed by the state or a county or municipality within the state, operating on-duty in direct support of a tactical law enforcement unit to provide medical services at high risk incidences including hostage incidents, narcotic raids, hazardous surveillance, sniper incidents, armed suicidal persons, barricaded suspect, felony warrant service, and fugitives refusing to surrender."

8 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 9 first day of the third month following its passage and 10 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
