25		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
26		1901 prohibits a general law whose purpose or
27		effect would be to require a new or increased
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expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this general law would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective with regard to a local entity unless approved by the local entity or until, and only as long as, the Legislature appropriates funds or provides for a local source of revenue.

## 17 A BILL

## TO BE ENTITLED

19 AN ACT

Relating to non-volunteer fire departments; to require a diesel exhaust system be installed in the fire station building within a certain time frame and under certain conditions; to provide exemptions; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) This act shall apply only to non-volunteer fire departments in the state that have firefighters on duty eight hours or more per day.

- (b) Any existing fire station that does not have a diesel exhaust system that captures the apparatus exhaust installed in the fire station building shall install a diesel exhaust system that captures the apparatus exhaust within five years of the effective date of this act.
- (c) The construction of any new fire station, where the design process for the fire station begins after the effective date of this act, shall have a diesel exhaust system incorporated in the design that captures diesel exhaust in the apparatus bay designed to house the apparatus truck. The fire station shall also have a separate room sealed from the apparatus bay to store the protective gear used by the firefighters of the station.
- (d) Any new construction of a fire station that commenced before the effective date of this act that does not have a diesel exhaust system included in the design of the fire station shall be required to install, within five years of the effective date of this act, a diesel exhaust system that captures the apparatus exhaust.
- (e) A fire station with an existing filter-type system in place on the effective date of this act is exempt from the provisions of this act, unless the existing filter-type system of the fire station needs replacing, and

then the fire station shall comply with the provisions of this act.

Section 2. This bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of funds, and thus, must be enacted by a 2/3 vote in order to be effective with regard to a local entity, unless approved by the local entity or until, and only as long as, the Legislature appropriates funds or provides for a local source of revenue.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
