As a part 9 10 of the registration, the owner applies for a number 11 assigned to the vessel. The owner is required to 12 paint or attach the number to each side of the bow 13 of the vessel and to attach decals for annual 14 registration. 15 This bill would require the Alabama Law 16 Enforcement Agency to issue five-year identification number stickers to be placed on both 17 18 sides of the bow of the vessel. The cost of the 19 identification number stickers, upon collection, 20 would be paid to the Department of Conservation and 21 Natural Resources earmarked for the operation of 2.2 the state parks.

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The bill would further authorize the owner of a vessel to obtain identification stickers supporting any organization authorized to obtain a distinctive motor vehicle license tag. The design of these various stickers would be subject to

1 approval by the Joint Legislative Oversight 2 Committee on License Tags and the secretary of the agency. The cost of distinctive identification 3 stickers would be \$50, with \$25 earmarked for the supported organization or fund and \$25 earmarked to 5 the Department of Conservation and Natural 6 7 Resources for the operation of the state parks. 8 9 A BILL 10 TO BE ENTITLED 11 AN ACT 12 13 Relating to the registration of vessels; to amend 14 Section 33-5-11 of the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the 15 numbering of vessels; to provide for identification number 16 stickers to be issued by the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency; 17 to authorize identification stickers supporting organizations under certain conditions; and to provide for fees and 18 distribution. 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 20 21 Section 1. Section 33-5-11 of the Code of Alabama 22 1975, is amended to read as follows: "\$33-5-11. 23 24 "(a) The Except as otherwise provided in subsection 25 (b), the owner of each vessel requiring numbering by this state shall file an application for a number with the probate 26

judges' offices, or license commissioner, in the county of

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1 residence of the purchaser, or the county in which the vessel 2 is domiciled, or in the county where the vessel is purchased, or if purchased out of state, in the county of residence of 3 the purchaser, or in the county where the vessel is domiciled 5 on forms approved by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Alabama Law Enforcement Agency. The 6 7 application shall be filed by the owner of the vessel and shall be accompanied by a fee in accordance with Section 8 33-5-17. Upon receipt of the application and its approval by 9 10 the authorized issuing officer, the officer shall enter the same upon the records and issue to the applicant a certificate 11 12 of registration stating the number awarded to the vessel, the 13 name and address of the owner, and a description of the 14 vessel. The owner shall paint on or attach to each side of the 15 bow of the vessel the annual an identification number sticker valid for five years issued in such manner as may be 16 17 prescribed by rules and regulations of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Alabama Law Enforcement 18 Agency, that it may be clearly visible and be of such size as 19 required by the Federal Boating Act of 1958 or any subsequent 20 21 amendment thereto. The number shall be maintained in legible 22 condition. The certificate of registration shall be pocket 23 size and shall be available at all times for inspection on the vessel for which issued whenever the vessel is in operation. 24 25 Each pair of five-year identification number stickers shall be 26 furnished by the agency for a cost of twenty dollars (\$20) 27 plus an additional two dollar (\$2) issuance fee. The issuance

fee shall be paid to the issuing officer in each county. The

proceeds from the issuance of the stickers, less the issuance

fee and cost of production and processing, shall be paid to

the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources earmarked

for the state parks.

"(b) In lieu of the regular identification number

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stickers issued by the agency and subject to certain transition provisions as further provided in subsection (c), the owner of a vessel may request five-year distinctive identification stickers showing support for any organization approved for the issuance of distinctive motor vehicle license tags as provided pursuant to Section 32-6-64. The design and use of the stickers shall be approved by the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on License Tags created pursuant to Section 32-6-67 and the secretary of the agency. The additional cost of distinctive identification stickers for a vessel shall be fifty dollars (\$50). Except as provided in subsection (c), twenty-five dollars (\$25) of the proceeds shall be distributed to the organization sponsoring the distinctive license tag and twenty-five dollars (\$25) less any additional cost of production and processing, shall be distributed to the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources earmarked for the operation of the state parks.

"(c) If the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on
License Tags has approved a distinctive design for a motor
vehicle license tag that does not currently provide revenue to
a sponsoring organization, the fifty dollars (\$50) additional

Т	cost, less any additional cost of production and processing,
2	shall be distributed to the Department of Conservation and
3	Natural Resources earmarked for the operation of the state
4	parks.
5	"(d) Notwithstanding subsection (b), the first
6	period for the issuance of a distinctive identification
7	sticker after approval by the joint committee shall be for a
8	period corresponding to the end of the current period of
9	registration for distinctive motor vehicle license tags for
10	the same sponsoring organization. The distinctive
11	identification stickers may then be renewed for five years on
12	the anniversary date for the renewal of a distinctive motor
13	vehicle license tag for the same sponsoring organization."
14	Section 2. This act shall be implemented on October
15	1, 2016.
16	Section 3. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
17	with this act are repealed.
18	Section 4. This act shall become effective
19	immediately following its passage and approval by the
20	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
