22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. This act shall relate only to any Class 2
24	municipality.
25	Section 2. Act No. 83-502 of the 1983 Regular
26	Session (Acts 1983, p. 708), is amended to read as follows:

1	"Section 1. (a) There is hereby created and
2	established the Mobile City Youth Athletic Board, hereinafter
3	referred to as the board.
4	"Each of the below listed associations of such city
5	shall have the authority to name one member on the said board:

6	other associations as the majority of the board from time to
7	time approve. The composition of the board in effect at the
8	time of the enactment of the act adding this language shall
9	remain. Additional members may be added to the board
10	representing associations admitted after the effective date of
11	this amendatory act. Each association in good standing
12	admitted by the board shall have the authority to name one
13	member to serve on the board.
14	"Section 2. Members of the board shall be appointed
15	from the associations admitted to the Youth Athletic Board.
16	first shall be appointed as follows: the members from
17	Municipal Park Baseball, Inc., Springhill Forest Youth A.A.,
18	Inc., Southern Little League, and Colts Youth Athletic
19	Association for a term of one year; the members from
20	Springhill Baseball, Inc., Cottage Hill Athletic Association,
21	Inc., Navco Athletic Association, Mims Park Youth Athletic
22	Association, Inc., and Cottage Hill Little League, Inc., for a
23	term of two years; the members from Skycrest Babe Ruth, Inc.,
24	Skyline Little League, Inc., Ranger Babe Ruth, Trimmier Park
25	Booster Association, Inc., and South Brookley Little League
26	for a term of three wears and the members from International

Babe Ruth, Loop Youth Athletic Association, Inc., National

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Little League, National Babe Ruth, and Advanced Babe Ruth for a term of four years. As the terms of members expire, their successors shall be selected for terms of four years each.

Vacancies in unexpired terms shall be filled in the same manner as original appointments are made.

"Section 3. A chairman chair and a vice-chairman vice chair shall be elected by the board from among its members. In the absence or incapacity of the chairman chair, the vice-chairman vice chair shall serve as chairman chair and may perform such the acts and duties as the chairman chair is authorized to perform. The power of said the board shall be vested in and exercised by a majority of the members of the board then in office. The board shall elect a secretary-treasurer from among its members to act as custodian of all the funds, from whatever source derived, received by said the board, and shall deposit said the monies in a separate interest-bearing checking account or account or accounts in one or more banks or trust companies which are duly qualified and doing business in Mobile County. Members of the board shall not be compensated for their services.

"Section 4. The board shall have the power and it shall be its duty to distribute to the various member associations the tax proceeds as provided in Section 6 of this act. The board shall have all other powers necessary to effect the purposes for which it has been established.

"Section 5. Each association <u>member</u> enumerated in Section 1 hereof shall register youths under 19 years of age

who reside <u>inside</u> <u>within</u> the corporate limits of the <u>city of</u>

Mobile Class 2 municipality and who are participants in the sports programs of the association. Registration shall consist of listing the name, address, and birthdate of the registrant. Any association found guilty of falsifying the registration of any participant shall, for each violation, automatically forfeit \$50.00 fifty dollars (\$50) of revenue to which it is entitled.

"Section 6. Fifty percent of the tax proceeds distributed to the city of Mobile Class 2 municipality pursuant to section Section 28-3-281, Code of Alabama 1975, shall be transferred by the city treasurer of the Class 2 municipality to the Mobile Youth Athletic Board to be deposited as provided in Section 3 hereof.

"During the 1983 calendar year, said tax proceeds shall be distributed in the following manner: Within thirty days after the effective date of this act, each association shall register youths according to Section 5 of this act.

Forty-five days after the effective date of this act, each association shall submit to the board a list of registrants.

Thereupon the board shall prorate the total amount of said tax proceeds for the per capita distribution according to the number of registrants of an association. In years subsequent to 1983, distribution Distribution of the tax proceeds shall be made in the manner as hereinafter set forth. On or before March 31 of each year, each association shall submit to the board a list of registrants. Thereupon the board shall prorate

the total amount of said the tax proceeds for the per capita distribution according to the number of registrants of an association. During the month of April of each year, the secretary-treasurer of the board is authorized to distribute to each association which is a member of the board, the prorat amount for each participant which they have registered in accordance with Section 5 of this act.

"Section 7. Each association shall submit an annual audit to the board and the Class 2 municipality on or before April 30 of each year reflecting all public funds received by the association and an itemized and verified list of expenditures of public funds as to how the funds were spent during the previous year. If public funds are co-mingled with private funds of the association, the annual audit shall include an itemization and verified list of expenditures of all funds of the association. An association failing to submit the required audits under this section shall not be eligible to receive any future distribution of public funds."

Section 3. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
