3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of 4 5 law, any time the victim is 12 years old or less and the adult criminal sex offender, as defined in Section 15-20-21(1), Code 6 7 of Alabama 1975, is 21 years or older at the time of the 8 offense, the criminal sex offender shall be surgically 9 castrated before being released from the custody of the 10 Department of Corrections. The cost of the procedure shall be paid by the adult criminal sex offender. 11

12 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 13 first day of the third month following its passage and 14 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
