3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

No person may be elected to the Alabama Senate for more than three full terms of office. No person may be elected to the Alabama House of Representatives for more than three full terms of office. An election to either the Senate or the House of Representatives pursuant to a special election shall not be deemed a full term.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with the provisions of Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama, 1901, as amended, and in accordance with the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the

following description of the substance or subject matter of 1 2 the proposed constitutional amendment: 3 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that no person may be elected to 4 5 the Alabama Senate and the House of Representatives for more than three full terms of office in each house. 6 "Proposed by Act ." 7 This description shall be followed by the following 8 9 language: 10 "Yes () No ()."
