8 "Any person shall be strictly liable for civil 9 damages who causes the <u>for causing</u> injury or damage to any 10 person or domestic animal as a result of using any trap or 11 similar device <u>in violation of state law or regulation</u> on 12 public land to take, capture, or kill any of the fur-bearing 13 animals protected by the laws or regulations of this state.

14 "Any person who suffers injury or damage to his
 15 person or domestic animal as a result of such activity shall
 16 have an action for civil damages and such aggrieved person
 17 need not prove negligence.

18 "The provisions of this section shall not apply to19 Lawrence County."

20 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 21 first day of the third month following its passage and 22 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
