1 This bill would also prohibit any person 2 hired on or after January 1, 2017, who is not 3 employed in a permanent full-time capacity with the 4 state, from participating in the Teachers' Retirement System of Alabama, the Public Education 5 Employees' Health Insurance Plan, or any health 6 7 insurance program governed and administered by the State Employees' Insurance Board. 8 9 10 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 11 12 AN ACT 13 To amend Sections 16-25-1, 16-25-10.1, 16-25-10.2, 14 15 16-25-10.3, 16-25-10.4, 16-25-10.5, 16-25-10.6, 16-25-10.7, 16-25-10.8, 16-25-10.9, 16-25-10.10, 16-25-10.11, 16-25-10.12, 16 17 16-25-32, 16-25A-11, and 36-29-14, Code of Alabama 1975, 18 relating to the Teachers' Retirement System and the Public 19 Education Employees' Health Insurance Plan, to prohibit any 20 officer or employee of the Alabama Education Association, 21 Alabama High School Athletic Association, Alabama Association 22 of School Boards, Alabama Council for School Administration 23 and Supervision, Alabama Vocational Association, Alabama 24 Congress of Parents and Teachers, Alabama Opportunities 25 Industrialization Center, Developing Alabama Youth Foundation, 26 Tennessee Valley Rehabilitation Center, Inc., American 27 Federation of Teachers, School Superintendents of Alabama,

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

15 Section 1. Sections 16-25-1, 16-25-10.1, 16-25-10.2,
16 16-25-10.3, 16-25-10.4, 16-25-10.5, 16-25-10.6, 16-25-10.7,
17 16-25-10.8, 16-25-10.9, 16-25-10.10, 16-25-10.11, 16-25-10.12,
18 16-25-32, 16-25A-11, and 36-29-14 of the Code of Alabama 1975,
19 are amended to read as follows:

21 "For the purposes of this chapter the following 22 terms, unless a different meaning is plainly required by the 23 context, shall have the following respective meanings:

24 "(1) RETIREMENT SYSTEM. The Teachers' Retirement
25 System of Alabama as defined in Section 16-25-2.

"(2) PUBLIC SCHOOL. Any day school conducted withinthe state under the authority and supervision of a duly

elected or appointed county or city board of education and any educational institution supported by and under the control of the state or any private nondenominational school operated nonprofit for the education of children of school age residing within a district where no public school is available for the children.

7 "(3) TEACHER. Any teacher, principal, 8 superintendent, supervisor, college professor, administrative officer, or clerk employed in any public school or public 9 10 college within the state or employed in any private 11 nondenominational school operated nonprofit for the education 12 of children of school age residing within a district where no 13 public school is available for the children or any similar employee or officer of the Department of Education or of the 14 15 Alabama Education Association, or any attendance worker 50 16 percent or more of whose salary is paid from public school 17 funds or any employee receiving a regular stated compensation 18 from the retirement system. In all cases of doubt, the Board 19 of Control shall determine whether any person is a teacher as 20 defined in this chapter. An employee or officer of the Alabama Education Association who is serving in that position before 21 22 January 1, 2017, is considered a teacher for purposes of this 23 chapter. An employee or officer of the Alabama Education 24 Association who begins serving in that position on or after 25 January 1, 2017, is not a teacher for purposes of this 26 chapter.

"(4) SUPPORT PERSONNEL or EMPLOYEE. Any maid,
 custodian, adult bus driver, lunchroom or cafeteria worker,
 secretary, clerk, clerical assistant, maintenance worker, or
 other non-certificated employee who works an average of 20
 hours weekly.

6 "(5) EMPLOYER. The State of Alabama, the county 7 school board, the city school board, the State Board of 8 Education, or any governing body of any private 9 nondenominational school operated nonprofit for education of 10 children of school age residing within a district where no 11 public school is available for the children or any other 12 agency of and within the state by which a teacher is paid.

"(6) MEMBER. Any teacher included in the membership
of the system as provided in Section 16-25-3.

"(7) BOARD OF CONTROL. The board provided for in
 Section 16-25-19 to administer the retirement system.

17 "(8) MEDICAL BOARD. The board of physicians provided18 for in Section 16-25-19.

19 "(9) TRUSTEES. The members of the Board of Control20 to administer the trust funds.

21

"(10) SERVICE. Service as a teacher.

"(11) PRIOR SERVICE. Service rendered prior to the date of establishment of the retirement system for which credit is allowable under Section 16-25-11.

25 "(12) MEMBERSHIP SERVICE. Service as a teacher 26 rendered while a member of the retirement system and on 27 account of which contributions are made. "(13) CREDITABLE SERVICE. "Prior service" plus
 "membership service" rendered since last becoming a member.

"(14) BENEFICIARY. Any person in receipt of a
pension, an annuity, a retirement allowance, or other benefit
as provided by this chapter.

"(15) REGULAR INTEREST. Interest compounded annually
at the rate determined by the Board of Control in accordance
with subsection (b) of Section 16-25-20.

9 "(16) ACCUMULATED CONTRIBUTIONS. The sum of all the 10 amounts deducted from the compensation of a member and 11 credited to his or her individual account in the annuity 12 savings fund together with regular interest thereon as 13 provided in Section 16-25-21.

"(17) EARNABLE COMPENSATION. The full rate of the 14 15 compensation that would be payable to a teacher if he or she 16 worked the full normal working time. In cases where 17 compensation includes maintenance, the Board of Control shall 18 fix the value of that part of the compensation not paid in 19 money. Earnable compensation shall not exceed the limitations 20 imposed by Section 401(a)(17) of the Internal Revenue Code for 21 public pension funds except that any employee who was a member 22 of the Teachers' Retirement System before the first plan year 23 beginning after December 31, 1995, shall not be subject to the earning limitations set forth in Section 401(a)(17). For Tier 24 25 I plan members, the term earnable compensation for retirement 26 purposes shall include overtime payments that are made to a 27 member; however, earnable compensation shall not exceed 120

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percent of any member's annual base compensation as certified by the employer. For Tier II plan members, earnable compensation shall include overtime payments that are made to the member but shall not include subsistence payments that are made to the member and shall not exceed one hundred twenty-five percent (125%) of the member's annual base compensation, as certified by the employer.

"(18) AVERAGE FINAL COMPENSATION. For any Tier I 8 Plan member, the average annual compensation of a teacher, 9 10 with respect to which he or she has made contributions 11 pursuant to paragraph b. of subdivision (1) of Section 12 16-25-21 during the three years in his or her last 10 years of 13 creditable service for which the average is highest or during his or her entire period of creditable service if less than 14 15 three years; except, that for any period prior to October 1, 16 1959, the compensation used in computing the average shall include compensation in excess of the maximum amount with 17 18 respect to which members were required to contribute. For any 19 Tier II Plan member, the average annual compensation of the 20 member, with respect to which he or she has made contributions 21 pursuant to paragraph b. of subdivision (1) of Section 22 16-25-21 during the five years in his or her last ten years of 23 creditable service for which the average is highest or during 24 his or her entire period of creditable service if less than 25 five years.

"(19) ANNUITY. Payments for life derived from the
 "accumulated contributions" of a member. All annuities shall
 be payable in equal monthly installments.

4 "(20) PENSION. Payments for life derived from money
5 provided by the employer. All pensions shall be payable in
6 equal monthly installments.

7 "(21) RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE. The sum of the "annuity"
8 and the "pension."

9 "(22) RETIREMENT. Withdrawal from active service 10 with a retirement allowance or optional benefit in lieu 11 thereof granted under this chapter.

12 "(23) ANNUITY RESERVE. The present value of all 13 payments to be made on account of any annuity or benefit in 14 lieu of any annuity, computed upon the basis of the mortality 15 tables as shall be adopted by the Board of Control, and 16 regular interest.

17 "(24) PENSION RESERVE. The present value of all 18 payments to be made on account of any pension or benefit in 19 lieu of any pension, computed upon the basis of the mortality 20 tables as shall be adopted by the Board of Control, and 21 regular interest.

"(25) ACTUARIAL EQUIVALENT. A benefit of equal
value, when computed upon the basis of the mortality tables as
shall be adopted by the Board of Control, and regular
interest.

"(26) NORMAL CONTRIBUTION. The contributions of the
 state necessary to provide a pension equal to the annuity

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which the member's contribution made prior to age 65 with
 interest will provide at age of retirement not to exceed 65.

3 "(27) TIER I PLAN. The defined benefit pension plan
4 provided by the Retirement System to Tier I plan members.

5 "(28) TIER II PLAN. The defined benefit pension plan 6 provided by the Retirement System to Tier II plan members.

7 "(29) TIER I PLAN MEMBER. Any member of the
8 Retirement System who had service for which he or she received
9 credit in the Teachers' Retirement System or in the Employees'
10 Retirement System prior to January 1, 2013.

"(30) TIER II PLAN MEMBER. Any member of the Retirement System who first began eligible employment with a Teachers' Retirement System or an Employees' Retirement System participating employer on or after January 1, 2013, and who had no eligible service in the Teachers' Retirement System or the Employees' Retirement System prior to January 1, 2013.

18 "(a) All persons now employed on a full-time basis 19 in an administrative or clerical capacity by the Alabama High 20 School Athletic Association, may become members of the 21 Teachers' Retirement System of Alabama within 90 days after 22 October 1, 1967, subject to such rules and regulations as may 23 be promulgated by the Board of Control of the Teachers' 24 Retirement System of Alabama. through a resolution as provided in subsection (a) of this
section, its employees and executive officers employed before
January 1, 2017, may participate in and be entitled to all

benefits of the Teachers' Retirement System of Alabama; 1 2 provided, that where contributions are made from salaries paid by the Alabama Council for School Administration and 3 Supervision, the Council for School Administration and 4 5 Supervision shall pay the employer costs, calculated as a percentage of the salaries of those employees, to be 6 7 contributed as employer in accordance with Section 16-25-21. Such The amounts shall be paid monthly and at the same time as 8 the members' contributions are made to the Teachers' 9 10 Retirement System.

13 "(a) Any person now serving as an elected superintendent of education in this state before January 1, 14 2017, may become a member of the Teachers' Retirement System 15 16 of Alabama within 90 days after the ratification of an 17 amendment to the Constitution of Alabama 1901 allowing elected 18 superintendents of education to participate in the Teachers' 19 Retirement System, subject to such rules and regulations as 20 may be promulgated by the Board of Control of said the system. 21 Any person hereafter elected to serve as superintendent of 22 education before January 1, 2017, shall be deemed to be a 23 "teacher" as defined in Section 16-25-1 and shall be entitled 24 to the benefits thereof. "(a) Any Before January 1, 2017, any agency of the 8 state, or any governmental entity, body, or subdivision 9 10 thereto, any county, any municipality, any municipal 11 foundation, any fire or water district, authority, or 12 cooperative, any regional planning and development commission established pursuant to Sections 11-85-50 through to 11-85-73, 13 inclusive, that is not and was not for the 12 months 14 15 immediately preceding the date of application to participate 16 in any plan created pursuant to the provisions of this article 17 a member of an existing government sponsored health insurance 18 program, formed under the provisions of Section 11-26-2, the 19 Association of County Commissions of Alabama or the Alabama 20 League of Municipalities, the Alabama Retired State Employees' 21 Association, the Alabama State Employees Credit Union, Easter 22 Seals Alabama, Alabama State University, the Alabama Rural 23 Water Association, Rainbow Omega, Incorporated, The Arc of 24 Alabama, Incorporated, and any of the affiliated local 25 chapters of The Arc of Alabama, Incorporated, United Ways of 26 Alabama and its member United Ways, the Alabama Network of 27 Children's Advocacy Centers and its member Children's Advocacy

Centers, any railroad authority organized pursuant to Chapter 1 2 13, Title 37, or any solid waste disposal authority organized pursuant to Chapter 89A, Title 11, by resolution legally 3 4 adopted to conform to rules prescribed by the State Employees' 5 Insurance Board, may elect to have its officers, members, employees, and retired employees become eligible for health 6 7 insurance coverage under the State Employees' Insurance Board without any liability to the state or the State Employees' 8 Health Insurance Plan. 9

10 "(b) Acceptance of the employees identified in 11 subsection (a) shall be optional with the State Employees' 12 Insurance Board.

The withdrawing employer 14 15 shall also be liable for interest which will accrue at a rate 16 of one and one-half percent per month on any monies due to the State Employees' Insurance Board which are over 30 days past 17 18 due. Any organization which provides or administers health 19 insurance benefits through the Local Government Health 20 Insurance Program shall not provide or administer health 21 insurance benefits to any entity which withdraws from the 22 Local Government Health Insurance Program for a period of two 23 years from the effective date of withdrawal.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and
approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
