27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Each local board of education shall annually establish a school calendar advisory committee to assist the local board of education in creating the local academic school calendar to be used by the school system for the ensuing year pursuant to paragraph c. of subdivision (1) of subsection (b) of Section 16-13-231, Code of Alabama 1975.

(b) The local board of education shall determine the size of the advisory committee and shall select the membership of the advisory committee from residents of the local school system. Members shall include parents of children currently enrolled in public school, representatives of local governmental and economic interests including, but not limited to, chambers of commerce, economic development authorities, industrial development authorities, real estate companies, elected governmental officials, local governing bodies, and agricultural operations. The membership of each advisory committee shall also be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of the local school system.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
