21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited
23	as the Alabama Heritage Preservation Act of 2015.
24	Section 2. For the purposes of this act, the
25	following terms shall have the following meanings:
26	(1) OBJECT OF REMEMBRANCE. A monument, memorial,
27	plaque, grave site with historical significance, or statue

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1 that commemorates an event, a person, a group, a movement, or 2 military service that is part of the history of the state.

3 (2) PUBLIC PROPERTY. All property owned or leased by
4 the State of Alabama; any county, municipal, or metropolitan
5 government in the state; or any other entity created by act of
6 the Legislature to perform any public function.

Section 3. (a) No object of remembrance which is
located on public property may be relocated, removed, altered,
renamed, or otherwise disturbed except as provided in Section
5.

(b) No school, street, bridge, building, park, preserve, or reserve which is located on public property and has been erected for, or named, or dedicated in honor of an event, a person, a group, a movement, or military service may be renamed, except as provided in Section 5.

16 Section 4. No person may prevent the governmental 17 entity having responsibility for maintaining any of the 18 objects, structures, or areas described in Section 3 from 19 taking proper and appropriate measures, and exercising proper 20 and appropriate means, for the protection, preservation, care, 21 repair, or restoration of those objects, structures, or areas.

22 Section 5. (a)(1) Any entity exercising control of 23 public property on which an object of remembrance is located 24 may petition the Alabama Legislative Council for a waiver from 25 subsection (a) of Section 3 in a deliberative process 26 established by administrative rule and certified by the Alabama Historical Commission. At a minimum, the deliberative
 process shall include all of the following:

a. A resolution by the controlling entity expressing
its intent to seek a waiver for the relocation, removal,
alteration, renaming, or other disturbance of an object of
remembrance. The resolution shall provide the dates, times,
and locations of two public hearings and the date, time, and
location of the controlling entity's consideration of public
input.

b. Advertisement of the resolution in a newspaper of
local circulation, once weekly for eight consecutive weeks, to
be placed at the expense of the controlling entity.

c. Signage providing the text of the resolution at
the site of the object of remembrance for eight consecutive
weeks, to be placed at the expense of the controlling entity.

d. Two hearings, conducted by the controlling
entity, for the collection of input from heritage, historical,
genealogical, and preservation organizations, and from the
general public.

e. Consideration and discussion of input from
organizations and the general public by the controlling entity
in a regular or called public meeting.

f. A petition in writing by the controlling entity, stating the reason or reasons upon which the waiver is sought and summarizing the input received from organizations and the general public. g. Certification by the Alabama Historical
 Commission to the Legislative Council that the controlling
 entity completed the required deliberative process.

4 (2) The Legislative Council may provide reasonable 5 conditions and instructions to ensure that the object of 6 remembrance is preserved to the greatest extent possible and 7 may deny a petition for waiver.

(b) Any entity exercising control of public property 8 on which a school, street, bridge, building, park, preserve, 9 10 or reserve is located may petition the Alabama Legislative Council for a waiver from subsection (b) of Section 3 in a 11 12 deliberative process to be established through administrative 13 rule and certified by the Alabama Historical Commission. At a minimum, the deliberative process shall include all of the 14 15 following:

(1) A resolution by the controlling entity
expressing its intent to seek a waiver for the renaming of the
school, street, bridge, building, park, preserve, or reserve.
The resolution shall provide the dates, times, and locations
of two public hearings and the date, time, and location of the
controlling entity's consideration of public input.

(2) Advertisement of the resolution in a newspaper
of local circulation, once weekly for eight consecutive weeks,
to be placed at the expense of the controlling entity.

(3) Signage providing the text of the resolution at
the site of the school, street, bridge, building, park,

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preserve, or reserve for eight consecutive weeks, to be placed
 at the expense of the controlling entity.

3 (4) Two hearings, conducted by the controlling
4 entity, for the collection of input from heritage, historical,
5 genealogical, and preservation organizations, and from the
6 general public.

7 (5) Consideration and discussion of input from
8 organizations and the general public by the controlling entity
9 in a regular or called public meeting.

10 (6) A petition in writing by the controlling entity, 11 stating the reason or reasons upon which the waiver is sought 12 and summarizing the input received from organizations and the 13 general public.

14 (7) Certification by the Alabama Historical
15 Commission to the Legislative Council that the controlling
16 entity completed the required deliberative process.

17 (c) If the Attorney General determines that an 18 entity exercising control of public property has removed an 19 object of remembrance from that public property without first 20 obtaining a waiver from the Legislative Council pursuant to 21 this section, the entity shall be fined one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for each violation. The fine shall be 22 23 collected by the Attorney General, forwarded by his or her 24 office to the State Treasurer, and deposited into the State 25 General Fund.

26 Section 6. This act does not apply to any of the 27 following: (1) Art and artifacts in the collections of museums,
 archives, and libraries.

(2) Objects, structures, or areas described in 3 Section 3 that are located on public property under the 4 5 control of, or acquired by, the State Department of Transportation, which may interfere with the construction, 6 7 maintenance, or operation of the public transportation system. The department shall strive to ensure that any such objects, 8 structures, or areas are preserved to the greatest extent 9 10 possible.

(3) Objects, structures, or areas described in 11 12 Section 3 that are located on public property under the control of, or acquired by, a county or municipal body or a 13 university, which may interfere with the construction, 14 maintenance, or operation of the public transportation system. 15 16 The governing body of the county, municipality, or university 17 shall strive to ensure that any such objects, structures, or areas are preserved to the greatest extent possible. 18

Section 7. This act shall become effective
 immediately following its passage and approval by the
 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
