3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the 5 Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Board of 6 Examiners of Mine Personnel, with the additional 7 recommendation for statutory change as set out in Section 3.

8 Section 2. The existence and functioning of the 9 Board of Examiners of Mine Personnel, created and functioning 10 pursuant to Sections 25-9-1 to 25-9-18, inclusive, Code of 11 Alabama 1975, is continued, and those code sections are 12 expressly preserved.

13 Section 3. Commencing on the effective date of this 14 act, the Board of Examiners of Mine Personnel is not subject 15 to review as an enumerated agency under the Alabama Sunset 16 Law.

17 Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the 18 recommendations of the Sunset Committee as provided in 19 Sections 1, 2, and 3.

20 Section 5. This act shall become effective 21 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or 22 its otherwise becoming law.
