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8 SYNOPSIS: The owner of a vessel is required to register the vessel on an annual basis. As a part of the registration, the owner applies for a number assigned to the vessel. The owner is required to paint or attach the number to each side of the bow of the vessel and to attach decals for annual registration.

This bill would require the Alabama Law
Enforcement Agency to issue five-year
identification number stickers to be placed on both
sides of the bow of the vessel. The cost of the
identification number stickers, upon collection,
would be paid to the Department of Conservation and
Natural Resources earmarked for the operation of
the state parks.

The bill would further authorize the owner of a vessel to obtain identification stickers supporting any organization authorized to obtain a distinctive motor vehicle license tag. The design of these various stickers would be subject to

1	approval by the Joint Legislative Oversight
2	Committee on License Tags and the secretary of the
3	agency. The annual cost of distinctive
4	identification stickers would be \$50, with \$25
5	earmarked for the supported organization or fund
6	and \$25 earmarked to the Department of Conservation
7	and Natural Resources for the operation of the
8	state parks.

21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. Section 33-5-11 of the Code of Alabama
23	1975, is amended to read as follows:
24	" §33-5-11.
25	"(a) The Except as otherwise provided in subsection
26	(b), the owner of each vessel requiring numbering by this
27	state shall file an application for a number with the probate

judges' offices, or license commissioner, in the county of 1 2 residence of the purchaser, or the county in which the vessel is domiciled, or in the county where the vessel is purchased, 3 or if purchased out of state, in the county of residence of 4 the purchaser, or in the county where the vessel is domiciled 5 on forms approved by the Department of Conservation and 7 Natural Resources Alabama Law Enforcement Agency. The application shall be filed by the owner of the vessel and 8 shall be accompanied by a fee in accordance with Section 9 10 33-5-17. Upon receipt of the application and its approval by 11 the authorized issuing officer, the officer shall enter the 12 same upon the records and issue to the applicant a certificate 13 of registration stating the number awarded to the vessel, the name and address of the owner, and a description of the 14 15 vessel. The owner shall paint on or attach to each side of the bow of the vessel the annual an identification number sticker 16 17 valid for five years issued in such manner as may be 18 prescribed by rules and regulations of the Department of 19 Conservation and Natural Resources Alabama Law Enforcement 20 Agency, that it may be clearly visible and be of such size as required by the Federal Boating Act of 1958 or any subsequent 21 22 amendment thereto. The number shall be maintained in legible 23 condition. The certificate of registration shall be pocket 24 size and shall be available at all times for inspection on the 25 vessel for which issued whenever the vessel is in operation. 26 Each pair of five-year identification number stickers shall be furnished by the agency for a cost of twenty dollars (\$20) 27

plus an additional two dollar (\$2) issuance fee. The issuance

fee shall be paid to the issuing officer in each county. The

proceeds from the issuance of the stickers, less the issuance

fee and cost of production and processing, shall be paid to

the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources earmarked

for the state parks.

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"(b) In lieu of the regular identification number stickers issued by the agency and subject to certain transition provisions as further provided in subsection (c), the owner of a vessel may request five-year distinctive identification stickers showing support for any organization approved for the issuance of distinctive motor vehicle license tags as provided pursuant to Section 32-6-64. The design and use of the stickers shall be approved by the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on License Tags created pursuant to Section 32-6-67 and the secretary of the agency. The additional cost of distinctive identification stickers for a vessel shall be fifty dollars (\$50). Except as provided in subsection (c), twenty-five dollars (\$25) of the proceeds shall be distributed to the organization sponsoring the distinctive license tag and twenty-five dollars (\$25) less any additional cost of production and processing, shall be distributed to the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources earmarked for the operation of the state parks.

"(c) If the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on

1	a sponsoring organization, the fifty dollars (\$50) additional
2	cost, less any additional cost of production and processing,
3	shall be distributed to the Department of Conservation and
4	Natural Resources earmarked for the operation of the state
5	parks.
6	"(d) The first period for the issuance of a
7	distinctive identification sticker after approval by the joint
8	committee shall be for a period corresponding to the end of
9	the current period of registration for distinctive motor
10	vehicle license tags for the same sponsoring organization. The
11	distinctive identification stickers may then be renewed for
12	five years on the anniversary date for the renewal of a
13	distinctive motor vehicle license tag for the same sponsoring
14	organization."
15	Section 2. This act shall be implemented on the
16	2016-2017 registration year for vessels.
17	Section 3. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
18	with this act are repealed.
19	Section 4. This act shall become effective
20	immediately following its passage and approval by the
21	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
