Amendment 617 to the Constitution of Alabama 8 SYNOPSIS: 9 of 1901, now appearing as Section 213.32 of the 10 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 11 Alabama of 1901, as amended, provides for the 12 issuance and sale of general obligation bonds of 13 the State of Alabama for the purpose of the 14 acquisition, provision, construction, improvement, 15 renovation, equipping, and maintenance of the State 16 Park System, public historical sites and public 17 historical parks. All state park system land and 18 facilities must be exclusively and solely operated 19 and maintained by the Department of Conservation 20 and Natural Resources.

This proposed amendment would except the operation of state park land and facilities at those state parks which offer overnight lodging accommodations to transients, or a golf course, or both, from the requirement to be exclusively and solely operated and maintained by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. The following amendment to the
15	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and
16	shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a
17	majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in
18	accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution
19	of Alabama of 1901, as amended:
20	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
21	"Amendment of Amendment 617.
22	"The State of Alabama is authorized to become
23	indebted for the purpose of the acquisition, provision,
24	construction, improvement, renovation, equipping, and
25	maintenance of the state parks system, public historical
26	sites, and public historical parks, and in evidence of the
27	indebtedness so incurred to sell and issue bonds, in addition

to all other bonds of the state, not exceeding one hundred ten 1 2 million dollars (\$110,000,000) in aggregate principal amount. The bonds shall be direct general obligations of the state and 3 the full faith and credit and taxing power of the state are 4 5 hereby pledged to the prompt and faithful payment of the principal thereof and the interest thereon. One hundred four 6 7 million dollars (\$104,000,000) of the bonds shall be issued for the state by the Alabama State Parks System Improvement 8 Corporation pursuant to the appropriate resolutions adopted by 9 10 the board of directors of the corporation and the proceeds 11 thereof shall be appropriated and used exclusively for the 12 purpose of paying the expenses incurred in the sale and 13 issuance of the bonds and for payment of the costs of the acquisition, provision, construction, improvement, renovation, 14 15 equipping, and maintenance of the state parks system; 16 provided, any lake acquired and/or built with the proceeds 17 thereof by the Department of Conservation and Natural 18 Resources as a part of a state park must have a minimum buffer 19 of six hundred (600) lateral feet between the shoreline and 20 any private property. In the event that the water from any said lake is sold, the cost thereof shall be equal to the 21 22 periodic costs for that portion of the bond issue incurred by 23 the Alabama State Parks System Improvement Corporation for 24 said lake, and shall be repaid to the Department of 25 Conservation and Natural Resources at the same rate as the 26 debt service on said bond issue. Such acquisition, provision, 27 construction, improvement, renovation, equipping and

maintenance of the state parks system, shall be completed at 1 2 the direction of the Alabama State Parks System Improvement Corporation with the advice and concurrence of the Joint 3 Legislative Committee on State Parks, and all state park 4 5 system land and facilities, except for existing concession 6 operations or other existing permitted operations state park 7 system land and facilities at those state parks with either (1) an establishment where sleeping or sleeping and eating 8 accommodations are advertised or held out to be available to 9 10 transients, including hotel rooms, cottages, and cabins, or 11 (2) a golf course, or both, shall thereafter be exclusively and solely operated and maintained by the Department of 12 13 Conservation and Natural Resources. This provision shall not 14 mandate operations by entities other than the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources but shall be construed to 15 16 permit such operations. Six million dollars (\$6,000,000) of 17 the bonds shall be issued for the state by the Alabama Public 18 Historical Sites and Parks Improvement Corporation pursuant to 19 the appropriate resolutions adopted by the board of directors 20 of the corporation and the proceeds thereof shall be 21 appropriated and used exclusively for the purpose of paying 22 the expenses incurred in the sale and issuance of the bonds 23 and for the payment of the costs of the acquisition, 24 provision, construction, improvement, renovations, equipping, 25 and maintenance of public historical sites and public 26 historical parks not under the jurisdiction of the Department 27 of Conservation and Natural Resources. Such acquisition,

provision, construction, improvement, renovation, equipping, 1 2 and maintenance of public historical sites and public historical parks shall be completed at the direction of the 3 Alabama Public Historical Sites and Parks Improvement 4 5 Corporation and shall thereafter be operated by the Alabama Historical Commission, or other entity as authorized by the 6 7 commission, with the advice and concurrence of the Joint Legislative Committee on State Parks. 8

9 "The State of Alabama is further authorized to 10 become indebted and in evidence thereof to sell and issue one 11 or more series of bonds to refund all or any of the bonds 12 hereinabove authorized by this amendment in such principal 13 amount or amounts, which may exceed the principal amount of 14 the bonds being refunded, and in such manner as may be 15 provided by law duly enacted by the Legislature.

16 "The aforesaid corporations are hereby vested with the power and authority to provide for the sale and terms of 17 18 the bonds hereby authorized and the issuance thereof, subject 19 to the approval of the Governor. The bonds may be sold, 20 executed, and delivered at any time and from time to time, may 21 be in such forms, denominations, series, and numbers, may be 22 of such tenor and maturities, may bear such date or dates, may be payable in such installments and at such place or places, 23 24 may bear interest at such rate or rates payable and evidenced 25 in such manner, and may contain provisions for redemption at 26 the option of the state to be exercised by the corporations at 27 such date or dates prior to their maturity and upon payment of

such redemption price or prices, all as shall be provided by 1 2 the corporations in the resolution or resolutions whereunder the bonds hereby authorized are issued. The principal of each 3 series of bonds shall mature on such date and in such amounts 4 5 as shall be specified in the resolution or resolutions of the board of directors of the corporations under which they are 6 7 issued, the last of which installments shall mature not later than 20 years after the date of the bonds of the same series. 8 All of the bonds, including refunding bonds, shall be sold 9 10 only at public sale or sales, either on sealed bids or at 11 public auction, after such advertisement as may be prescribed 12 by the corporations, to the bidder whose bid reflects the lowest true interest cost to the state computed to the 13 respective maturities of the bonds sold; provided, that if no 14 bid deemed acceptable by the corporation is received, all bids 15 16 may be rejected.

17 "The bonds shall be signed in the name of the state 18 by the Governor of the State of Alabama and the Great Seal of the State of Alabama or a facsimile thereof shall be 19 20 impressed, printed or otherwise reproduced thereon and shall 21 be attested by the signature of the Secretary of State of the 22 State of Alabama; provided that facsimile signatures of either 23 or both of the officers may be reproduced on such bonds in 24 lieu of their manually signing the same.

25 "All bonds issued under the provisions of this26 amendment, together with the interest income thereon, shall

forever be exempt from all taxation in the state, except
 inheritance, estate and gift taxes.

"The proceeds from the sale of the bonds by the 3 4 Alabama State Parks System Improvement Corporation hereby 5 authorized, other than refunding bonds, after the payment of all expenses of the sale thereof, shall be set apart in a 6 special fund in the State Treasury to be designated "The 7 Alabama State Parks System Improvement Fund," and such 8 proceeds, together with income derived from the investment and 9 10 reinvestment thereof, shall be temporarily invested until 11 needed and disbursed, on order of the aforesaid corporation 12 solely for the purposes, hereinabove described, for which the 13 bonds are authorized to be issued.

"The proceeds from the sale of the bonds by the 14 15 Alabama Public Historical Sites and Parks Improvement 16 Corporation hereby authorized, other than refunding bonds, 17 after the payment of all expenses of the sale thereof, shall 18 be set apart in a special fund in the State Treasury to be 19 designated "The Alabama Public Historical Sites and Parks 20 Improvement Fund," and such proceeds, together with income derived from the investment and reinvestment thereof, shall be 21 22 temporarily invested until needed and disbursed, on order of 23 the aforesaid corporation solely for the purposes, hereinabove 24 described, for which the bonds are authorized to be issued.

"No further authorization from the Legislature shall
be a prerequisite to the validity of any bonds issued
hereunder. However, the Legislature shall enact appropriate

legislation implementing the provisions hereof, including
 provisions for the issuance of refunding bonds as hereinabove
 authorized.

4 "The Alabama State Parks System Improvement
5 Corporation and the Alabama Public Historical Sites and Parks
6 Improvement Corporation authorized in this constitutional
7 amendment are strongly encouraged to utilize businesses and
8 companies in all aspects of the bond and construction portions
9 of this amendment that reflect the racial and ethnic diversity
10 of the state."

11 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 12 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 13 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 14 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 15 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 16 state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to Amendment 617 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to allow the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources the option to provide for the operation and management, by non-state entities, of hotels, golf courses, and restaurants at any applicable state parks in Alabama. 1 "Proposed by Act _____."
