20	To amend Section 41-9-243 of the Code of Alabama
21	1975, relating to the Alabama Historical Commission to include
22	an appointee from the Alabama Black Heritage Council.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Section 41-9-243 of the Code of Alabama
25	1975, is amended to read as follows:
2.6	" \$41-9-243.

"The commission shall consist of 20 21 members, one 1 of whom shall be the Governor, one of whom shall be the 2 Lieutenant Governor, one of whom shall be the Speaker of the 3 House of Representatives, one of whom shall be the Director of 4 the Department of Archives and History, one of whom shall be the Director of the Alabama Tourism Department, one of whom 7 shall be the Commissioner of Conservation and Natural Resources, one of whom shall be the Director of the Technical 8 Staff of the Alabama Building Commission, and $\frac{13}{14}$ 14 other 9 10 persons to be appointed by the Governor, one of whom shall be 11 selected from a list of three nominees submitted by the 12 Alabama Council of the American Institute of Architects, one 13 from a list of three nominees submitted by the Alabama Historical Association, one from a list of three nominees 14 15 submitted by the Alabama State Chamber of Commerce, one from a list of three nominees submitted by the Alabama Farmers 16 17 Federation, one from a list of three nominees submitted by the 18 President of the University of Alabama, one from a list of 19 three nominees submitted by the President of Auburn 20 University, one from a list of three nominees submitted by the President of the University of South Alabama, one from a list 21 22 of three nominees submitted by the President of Troy 23 University, one from a list of three nominees submitted by the 24 President of the University of Montevallo, one from a list of 25 three qualified archaeologists nominated by the Alabama 26 Archaeological Society, one from a list of three nominees 27 submitted by the Alabama Black Heritage Council, and three

from the state at-large. The membership of the commission shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.

"The nominees and appointees shall be persons who have demonstrated interest in and concern about the preservation of this state's rich history and traditions and who are conversant with the history of the state and who are qualified to direct and supervise the work of the commission.

"The members appointed by the Governor shall be citizens of this state and shall serve for terms of six years each; except, that the terms of the members of the first commission shall be three years for one half of the members appointed by the Governor and six years for the remaining members. After the expiration of the term of the initial members, all members appointed by the Governor shall be appointed for terms of six years each.

"Any member of the commission may be removed by the Governor for cause, and vacancies in the commission shall be filled by the Governor by the appointment of a competent and qualified person for the unexpired term, from a list of three nominees submitted to him or her by the organization which originally nominated the member being replaced.

"The Chair of the Restructured Historic
Chattahoochee Commission shall serve as an ex officio policy
making member of the commission."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
