22	Section 1. Section 17-6-25, Code of Alabama 1975, is
23	amended to read as follows:

25	"The names of candidates for each office shall be
26	listed on the ballot in alphabetical order by surname, and the
27	offices shall be listed in the following order:

1	"(1) President (if preference primary).
2	"(2) Delegate to national convention.
3	" <u>(3)</u> Governor.
4	" (4)<u>(</u>3) Lieutenant Governor.
5	" (5)<u>(</u>4) United States senator.
6	" (6)<u>(5)</u> United States representative.
7	" (7)<u>(6)</u> Attorney General.
8	" <u>(8)</u> (7) State senator.
9	" (9)<u>(8)</u> State representative.
10	" (10)<u>(9)</u> Supreme Court justice.
11	" (11)<u>(10)</u> Court of Civil Appeals judge.
12	" (12)<u>(</u>11) Court of Criminal Appeals judge.
13	" (13)<u>(12)</u> Secretary of State.
14	" (14)<u>(13)</u> State Treasurer.
