11	To amend Sections 1, 2, and 3 of Act 2015-27, now
12	appearing as Sections 40-18-370 and 40-18-376.2, Code of
13	Alabama 1975, relating to the Alabama Jobs Act, to provide
14	that companies that employed eligible employees by or through
15	a qualifying project located within a former active duty
16	military installation closed by the Base Realignment and
17	Closure process are entitled to an additional jobs credit.
18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. Sections 1, 2, and 3 of Act 2015-27, now
20	appearing as Sections 40-18-370 and 40-18-376.2, and Section
21	41-23-21, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as
22	follows:
23	"§40-18-370.
24	"(a) This article shall be known and may be cited as
25	the Alabama Jobs Act.
26	"(b) The Legislature makes the following findings:

"(1) The economic well-being of the citizens of the
 state will be enhanced by the increased development and growth
 of employment within Alabama.

4 "(2) It is in the best interests of the state to
5 provide certain incentives to allow the state to foster
6 economic development through the recruitment of quality
7 projects and the expansion of existing businesses within
8 Alabama.

9 "(3) The incentives provided for in this article do 10 not raise any taxes for any individuals or businesses in 11 Alabama under state law.

"(4) The incentives provided in this article will allow the state to encourage the creation of new jobs that may not otherwise exist within the State of Alabama.

15 "(5) The incentives provided in this article will16 increase revenues for the state without increasing taxes.

17 "(6) The Constitution of the State of Alabama grants 18 the Legislature the authority to approve and authorize 19 exemptions, exclusions, deductions, and credits from taxation 20 in order to define the net proceeds of any tax payable under 21 state law.

"(7) The Constitution of the State of Alabama was
framed, and the laws of the state were enacted, with the goal
of protecting, encouraging, and developing individual
enterprise.

"(8) The incentives provided in this article willnot decrease the salary paid to any education personnel.

"(9) The powers to be granted and the purposes to be 1 2 accomplished by this article will create an environment for 3 the recruitment of quality projects and the expansion of 4 existing businesses within Alabama. 5 "(10) Economic development through tax and financial incentives benefits the citizens of the state and is a public 6 7 purpose of the state. "(c) In addition to the definitions found at Section 8 40-18-1, the following words and phrases shall have the 9 10 following meanings: "(1) APPROVED COMPANY. Any company determined by the 11 12 Secretary of Commerce and the Governor to meet the criteria 13 provided in Section 40-18-373. "(2) CAPITAL INVESTMENT. All costs and expenses 14 15 incurred by the incentivized company in connection with the 16 acquisition, construction, installation, and equipping of a 17 qualifying project, if such costs are required to be 18 capitalized for purposes of the federal income tax, determined 19 without regard to any rule that permits expenditures properly 20 chargeable to a capital account to be treated as current expenditures. However, for any project involving the 21 22 extraction of natural resources, the capital investment shall 23 not include the costs of acquiring land, land recording fees, 24 architectural and engineering services, environmental studies 25 and environmental mitigation.

26 "(3) COMPANY. Anyone or anything which has the27 powers to own a project and have employees.

"(4) ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES. Those employee positions
 set forth in a project agreement that will be the result of
 new jobs created by or through a qualifying project.

4 "(5) EMPLOYEES. Some or all of those persons
5 employed and residing in Alabama:

"a. Who are being paid directly by an approved
company, related company, common paymaster, joint venturer, or
leasing company for working at a qualifying project;

9 "b. Whom the approved company, related company, 10 common paymaster, joint venturer or leasing company identifies 11 as its employees to the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, the 12 Department of Revenue, or the Department of Labor on returns 13 or reports filed with the foregoing, including, but not 14 limited to, IRS Form 941; and

15 "c. Who are assigned to a qualifying project for a16 period of at least one year.

"(6) INCENTIVE PERIOD. The period or periods of time
during which an incentivized company can receive one or more
of the jobs act incentives.

"(7) INCENTIVIZED COMPANY. An approved company and
 any related company that are allowed to claim either or both
 <u>one or more</u> of the jobs act incentives as provided for in the
 project agreement.

24 "(8) INVESTMENT CREDIT. The annual incentive25 provided in Section 40-18-376.

"(9) JOBS ACT INCENTIVES. The jobs credit and the
 investment credit as authorized and provided for in this
 article.

4 "(10) JOBS CREDIT. The annual incentive provided in
5 Section 40-18-375.

"(11) NAICS CODE. Any sector, subsector, industry
group, industry or national industry of the 2012 North
American Industry Classification System, or any similar
classification system developed in conjunction with the United
States Department of Commerce or Office of Management and
Budget.

12 "(12) PROJECT. Any land, building, or other 13 improvements, and all real and personal properties, whether or 14 not contiguous and whether or not previously in existence, if 15 in Alabama and if deemed necessary or useful in connection 16 with an activity listed in Section 40-18-372(a).

17 "(13) PROJECT AGREEMENT. The agreement entered into 18 between an approved company and the Governor establishing the 19 terms and conditions for the provision of the jobs act 20 incentives, as provided for in Section 40-18-374.

"(14) QUALIFYING PROJECT. Any project to be undertaken by an approved company that satisfies Section 40-18-372.

"(15) RELATED COMPANY. Any company that is under
 common ownership, management, or control with a company or an
 approved company, as the case may be.

"(16) UTILITY TAXES. The taxes imposed by Sections
 40-21-82 and 40-21-102.

3 "(17) WAGES. Total wages of an employee (including 4 gross wages, salaries, overtime and bonuses), defined by 5 reference to Section 25-4-16(b), without application of 6 Sections 25-4-16(b)(1), 25-4-16(b)(2)a., 25-4-16(b)(3), and 7 25-4-16(b)(4).

"§40-18-376.2.

9 "(a) The provisions in this section shall apply to 10 the following:

"any (1) Any incentivized company that employed, in the prior year, at least 12 percent of its eligible employees as veterans who received an honorable or general discharge. The calculation of the percentage of eligible employees who are veterans shall be made using the method provided in a project agreement.

17 "(2) Any incentivized company that employed eligible
18 employees by or through a qualifying project located within a
19 former active duty military installation closed by the Base
20 Realignment and Closure process.

21 "(b) (1) Any incentivized company described by
22 <u>subdivision (1) of</u> subsection (a) shall receive an additional
23 0.5 percent jobs credit provided in Section 40-18-375(a) on
24 the wages paid during the prior year to eligible employees who
25 are veterans.

26 "(2) Any incentivized company described by
 27 subdivision (2) of subsection (a) shall receive an additional

<u>0.5 percent jobs credit provided in Section 40-18-375(a) on</u>
 <u>the wages paid during the prior year to its eligible</u>
 employees.

4 "(c) No incentivized company claiming the credit
5 provided by <u>subdivision (1) of</u> subsection (b) shall also claim
6 the credit provided by Article 13 of this chapter for any
7 portion of the project.

"(d) The Department of Labor shall periodically 8 verify the actual number of veterans employed by the 9 10 incentivized company described in subdivision (1) of 11 subsection (a) and the wages of the veterans during the 12 relevant year. If the Department of Labor is not able to 13 provide the verification utilizing all available resources, it may request any additional information from the incentivized 14 15 company as may be necessary."

17 "For purposes of this article, the following terms
18 shall have the meaning hereinafter ascribed to them, unless
19 the context clearly indicates otherwise:

20 "(1) COUNCIL. The Enterprise Zone Advisory Council.

"(2) DEPARTMENT. The Alabama Department of Economicand Community Affairs.

23 "(3) GOVERNING AUTHORITY. The governing body of a24 county or municipality.

"(4) ENTERPRISE ZONE. A geographic area which is
economically depressed, in need of expansion of business and
industry and the creation of jobs and designated to be

eligible for the benefits of this article, and is a target by 1 2 governments for development by providing tax and nontax incentives to private enterprise. Effective October 1, 2016, 3 4 the definition of an Enterprise Zone shall mean any Alabama 5 county that is described by Section 40-18-376.1(a), Code of Alabama, 1975. Notwithstanding any other law or agreement to 6 7 the contrary, any eligible business having received an 8 approved application from the department prior to October 1, 2016 shall continue to receive those approved exemptions for 9 10 the period of time specified in those agreements. 11 "(5) RURAL ENTERPRISE ZONE. An enterprise zone 12 located in a non-MSA county, as such is defined by the United 13 States Bureau of the Census. "(6) URBAN ENTERPRISE ZONE. An enterprise zone 14 15 located in an MSA county, as such is defined by the United States Bureau of the Census." 16 17 Section 2. This act shall become effective 18 immediately following its passage and approval by the 19 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
