There is no provision in 13 current law for the issuance of a lifetime 14 waterfowl stamp. 15 This bill would provide for the department 16 to issue a lifetime waterfowl stamp and establishes 17 the fees for a lifetime stamp. The bill would also 18 provide for cost-of-living adjustments for the annual fee and the lifetime fees. 19 20 21 A BILL 22 TO BE ENTITLED 23 AN ACT 24 25 To amend Section 9-11-433, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to issuance of annual stamps for waterfowl hunting; 26

to provide for the issuance of lifetime waterfowl stamps and 1 2 to establish fees; and to provide for adjustment of the fees. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. Section 9-11-433, Code of Alabama 1975, 4 5 is amended to read as follows: "§9-11-433. 6 7 "(a) A stamp shall be issued to each hunting license applicant by the judge of probate or issuing officer of any 8 county of the state or other authorized license agent as 9 10 provided herein upon the payment of a fee of five dollars 11 (\$5). Each stamp shall be valid for the duration of one 12 hunting season as established by the department. Stamps shall 13 be available for sale prior to any waterfowl season, including any special season which may precede the regular season. 14 15 "(b) In lieu of an annual stamp, a lifetime migratory waterfowl stamp may be purchased by or for 16 17 individuals meeting the residency requirements set out in 18 Section 9-11-44 for the following license fees: 19 "(1) Persons less than two years old, sixty-five 20 dollars (\$65). "(2) Persons age two through 11 years old, 21 22 eighty-five dollars (\$85). 23 "(3) Persons age 12 through 49 years, one hundred 24 five dollars (\$105). 25 "(4) Persons age 50 years and above, sixty-five dollars (\$65). 26

1 "(c) The fees provided in subsections (a) and (b)
2 shall be subject to adjustment pursuant to Section 9-11-68,
3 which adjustments shall be on a proportional basis.

"(d) The judge of probate, or issuing officer, or 4 5 other authorized license agent as provided herein shall be allowed a fee of one dollar (\$1) for each license issued, 6 7 which issuing fee shall be in addition to the cost of the stamp and shall be subject to adjustment as provided for in 8 Section 9-11-68. In counties where the judge of probate or 9 10 issuing officer is on the fee system, the issuing fee shall be retained by the judge of probate or issuing officer, and in 11 12 counties where the judge of probate or issuing officer is on a 13 salary basis, the fee shall be paid into the county treasury to the credit of the appropriate fund. 14

15 "(e) Other license agents as authorized by the 16 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources may issue 17 migratory waterfowl stamps, provided the other authorized 18 license agents prepurchase sheets of stamps for resale at face 19 value plus the issuance fee provided herein. An agent shall 20 place an initial order for one or more sheets of 10 stamps each for the license year. At the end of the license period, 21 22 the agent may return unsold stamps for a refund."

23 Section 2. This act shall become effective 24 immediately following its passage and approval by the 25 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
